UNCONFIRMED MINUTES OF THE EFC BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS

Item 01 Opening of the meeting

Prof. Philippe Marcus, President of the EFC and chairman of the meeting, opened the meeting and welcomed the delegates present (see attendance list).

Item 02 Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from the following:

Item 1 Approval of the Agenda and Adoption of the Minutes of the last Meeting

1-1 The proposed agenda was approved.

1-2 The minutes of the previous meeting in Stockholm (25 March 2011) were approved.

Item 2 Report on STAC Activities

Dr. Damien Féron, STAC Chairman, reviewed progress in the STAC, as follows:

Working Party Activity Reports: For the first time, all the Working Parties were represented at the meeting held on Sept. 4th in Stockholm, and all the Working Party reports (with the exception of one) had been transmitted.

The STAC has launched a **Task Force** on corrosion topics related to **CCS** (CO₂ Capture and Storage), chaired by Ralph Bässler (BAM). Its aim will be to liaise and collaborate with the NACE Task Group already working on this same topic.

Working Parties 11, 18 and 20 Reports: these Working Parties are very active. Working Party 20 is involved with WCO for Drinking Water and will organise a Workshop at the ICC conference in Perth (Australia) in November 2011.

Guidelines for EFC Event Numbers: The STAC approved the modification of the EFC Event Number application form and proposed to prepare short guidelines.

Corrosion Courses: A lengthy discussion took place during the STAC meeting. An informal agreement was obtained regarding the following:

- all Corrosion Courses should be published on a dedicated web page like the other EFC Events;
- An EFC Event Number should be given for each Course. For this to take place, the EFC Bye-Laws will have to be changed.

- Possible “accreditation” or “approval” of these courses will be organised in the future.

EFC Awards: the STAC elected the members of the Cavallaro Medal Jury and the Kurt Schwabe Prize to be presented at EUROCORN 2012. Members of the Jury for the Best Poster at EUROCORN 2011 were also elected.

EFC Publication: It was reported that Maney had edited 6 books produced by EFC Working Party members over the past year and that a forthcoming joint work on Marine Corrosion (EFC 63) produced by EFC Working Party 9 and NACE’s STG 44 would soon be coming out.

Changing of WP Chairmen: 4 Working Party Chairmen will be replaced in 2012 for Working Parties 7, 10 and 13 and 16.

Item 3 Administrative Matters

3-1 Status of Applications for EFC Membership

The Frankfurt Office reported on the application of new members as follows:

ACA (Australasian Corrosion Association): during the summer of 2011 BoA and GA had approved their application as International Member.

Prof. Dr. Rolf Gubner informed the BoA that as a new EFC member the ACA would be in a good position to cooperate with the EFC in the form of exchanges on specific technical topics as they do with other member societies in other parts of the world.

BoA Members were also requested to note that:

- Curtin University has resigned as Affiliate Member due to the fact that it is already a member of the ACA;
- the Engineering Society of Corrosion has replaced the Yugoslav Society of Materials Protection as the EFC Member Society from Serbia.

BoA approved the following applications for EFC Affiliate membership and proposed the ratification of this decision by the GA:

- ATV-SEMAPP (DANCORR) for Denmark, replacing FORCE Technology;
- SOPCOR for Russia.

CAMPI (Member Society from Israël) representative Dr. Eliezer voiced his discontent over the fact that his organization’s membership category has been reclassified to that of an International EFC Member Society over its previous status as a European Member society. The EFC President explained that the BoA had to reclassify CAMPI’s membership status in order to be in conformity with the updated EFC Statutes in place since 2006 which specify that an EFC European Member society must be a society based in an European country as defined by the Council of Europe in Brussels. The BoA expressed its sentiment that it understands Dr. Eliezer’s dissatisfaction with this change in membership category but pointed out that a change in membership classification offered no disadvantages over European membership status and that the Federation was constrained to be in conformity with the revised EFC Statutes which had been approved after the initial acceptance of Israël as EFC Member.

3-2 Pro-rata Payment for new EFC Members

Following the request of new applicants, at its last meeting the President’s Advisory Committee meeting discussed calculating membership fees on a pro-rata for new applications received and approved after the first of the new year or any time thereafter.

Following BoA recommendation, the GA will be requested to approve this new policy instating this pro-rata membership fee calculation which will be applicable upon the date of the approval of the membership application.

3-3 *Discount for Affiliate Members for EUROCORR Exhibition Fee*

In order to encourage international exhibitors to consistently have booths at EUROCORR conferences every year, the BoA approved the possibility to offer a discount (suggested at 20%) to the Affiliate Members who would be interested in hiring an exhibition booth at EUROCORR Exhibition.

Following BoA recommendation, the GA will be requested to approve this proposal, starting from 2013 with the agreement of Portugal and Italy. The Eurocorr contract between the EFC and the local organizer will be amended to add this agreement on the part of the local organizer.

Item 4 Interaction with other Organisations

4-1 *EFC/NACE Collaboration*

4-1.1 *Meeting of EFC and NACE in Stockholm during EUROCORR 2011*

A meeting between EFC and NACE was scheduled to take place on Monday, September 5, 2011, on lunch time.

A new specific item deals with CCS (see in item 2).

The EFC President reminded the BoA members about the main reciprocal agreements between EFC and NACE including: Joint Meetings, Representation on Technical Committees, Exchange of Minutes, Exhibition Booths and Publicity for conferences, Joint Workshops, joint stands at Nace and Eurocorr conferences as well as jointly-recognized standards and publications alternately coordinated by NACE and EFC in turn such as the upcoming publication on the EFC's Working Party 9 book on Marine Corrosion.

Prof. Bernd Isecke proposed to add an item for collaboration on "Materials in geothermal energy plants". A large R&D project has been launched in Europe on this topic and he proposed this subject for the next agenda of the STAC meeting in 2012.

4-2 *World Corrosion Organisation*

Progress on EFC/WCO collaboration has been presented by Prof. Michael Schütze.

It was reminded that WCO meets twice a year: once on the occasion of the NACE Conference and the other on the occasion of another international event.

No meeting was organised during EUROCORR 2011 due to the fact that the ICC Conference in Perth will be the venue for this encounter this year. In the event that the EFC President cannot attend this conference, he will propose to Prof. Günter Schmitt to represent the EFC.

Dr. Paul McIntyre was formerly the WCO Secretary. In order to ensure the continuity of the EFC secretariat support to the WCO, BoA Members agreed to propose the

appointment of Mrs. Juliet Ippolito as successor to Dr. Paul McIntyre, but only for meetings which are organised on the occasion of NACE and EUROCORR conferences.

A series of workshops concerning supply and storage of drinking water will be organised by WCO in different worldwide locations. One such event will be organised during EUROCORR 2012 in Istanbul. It is expected that this session could lead to the creation of a new "White Paper".

In response to the discussion at the last PAC meeting, the Frankfurt Office has deleted the sentence "*Availability of Affiliate Membership of the WCO at no additional cost subject to the approval of the WCO Board of Administrators and the WCO General Assembly*" on the web page describing the benefits for Affiliates Member.

Note: the approval of BoA and GA and discussion with the WCO Director were not necessary for this modification which is simply a correction of an existing form.

4-3 ICC

No report on the recent ICC activities was presented due to the absence of M. Antoine Pourbaix.

The next ICC conference will take place in Perth, Australia on 20-24 November, 2011. Prof. Dr. Rolf Gubner informed that this event is organised by ACA and that 433 papers have been reviewed.

The location of the following ICC conference, which will be in 2014, will be decided in Perth.

Item 5 EFC Activities and Projects

5-1 Report of the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer

The report of the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer, covering activities since the last meeting was presented in Appendix 1 of the Working Papers.

The BoA approved the Scientific Secretary / Public Relations Officer's Report.

5-2 EFC Publications

5-2-1 EFC Series

EFC STAC Chairman, Dr. Damien Féron, reported on the progress in the preparation of books for the EFC Series.

He reported that 5 books had been issued on schedule and a 6th one was forthcoming.

Two books have been published in addition to the 4 ones given in Appendix 2, of the Working Papers:

- EFC 60: "**Methodology of Crevice Corrosion Testing for Stainless Steels in Natural and Treated Seawaters**" Edited by U. Kivisäkk.
- EFC 61: "**Inter-Laboratory Study on Electrochemical Methods for the Characterisation of CoCrMo Biomedical Alloys in Simulated Body Fluids**" Edited by A. Igual Munoz and S. Mischler

Currently there is no EFC book pending but a joint work on Marine Corrosion (EFC 63) produced by EFC Working Party 9 and NACE's STG 44 would soon be published.

It was agreed that, based on experience, EFC-produced Guidelines sell the best.

The decision concerning the publishing contract with Maney has to be taken before March 2012. A meeting of the EFC President, the STAC Chairman and the Honorary Treasurer with M. Michael Gallico of Maney will be organised before the next PAC Meeting .

Dr. Damien Féron has contacted Woodhead Publishers England who have shown interest to publish EFC Books and Prof. Michael Schütze has still to contact TTP in Switzerland.

5-2-2 EFC Electronic Newsletter

The second EFC e-Newsletter, prepared by Mrs. Juliet Ippolito was circulated to over 2.000 people by DECHEMA for the occasion of the Corrosion Awareness Day on 24 April 2011, an initiative of the WCO.

The BoA emphasised that all EFC Member Societies should circulate this e-Newsletter to their own members in order to reach the 25 to 30 000 EFC Members.

The BoA discussed the content and frequency of this e-Newsletter. It was decided that immediately following the occasion of Eurocorr, a pdf file of September's hard-copy newsletter would be circulated to EFC's database by Dechema including a coverletter written by the S.S. reporting on the recent Eurocorr event.

It was suggested that EFC national societies be requested to put a copy of the EFC newsletter on their own websites.

5-2-3 EFC Newsletter

A hardcopy Newsletter, N° 19, was prepared by Juliet Ippolito, the new Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer and distributed on the occasion of EUROCORR 2011. The BoA confirmed the interest of this Newsletter.

5-2-4 Progress with items/articles for Publication in "Materials and Corrosion"

Dr. Roman Bender reported on progress regarding the corrosion-related publications in "Materials and Corrosion". Information on Working Parties 5, 8 and 17 has been published together with an updated Calendar of Events in a dedicated Corrosion section. The Working Party Chairmen were invited to supply material for publication in this journal.

Prof. Dr. Michael Schütze proposed to include the most interesting parts of the EFC Newsletter (which could be selected by the EFC President and Scientific Secretary).

5-3 EFC Website

The BoA members are reminded of the login and password, which allow them direct connection to the restricted area of the website:

Login: efc-boa
 Password: edinburgh

Dr. Roman Bender reminded everyone that Working Party Chairmen can request the opening of their “restricted areas” to the official members of their Working Parties.

In order to encourage the updating of their webpages by the Chairmen of the Working Parties, Juliet Ippolito proposed that a standardized form be created so that WPs can consistently report their updated information.

Item 6 Finance

6-1 Honorary Treasurer’s Report

The Honorary Treasurer presented the EFC Financial Report (see Appendix 3 of the Working Papers).

He emphasised that the reserves are now 177 % of the budget expenditures for 2011 which exceeds budgetary objectives and this was partly due to the increase of new members and the temporary decrease in the interim absence of an active Scientific Secretary.

An action was placed on the PAC to define new objectives to increase the EFC’s incoming revenue such as increased advertising of EUROCORR to incite interest and participation in the Congress as well as Exhibitors booths and possibly holding a second more specific annual Conference, etc.

Discussion took place concerning strategies to enhance the EUROCORR conferences including possibly smaller more specific workshops with the surplus of abstracts received, attracting young people as well as exhibitors.

BoA Members approved the annual financial statement for the year ending 31 December 2010.

The budget for 2012 was approved.

BoA Members also approved the Honorary Treasurer’s Report.

Item 7 EUROCORR Series: 2011 to 2015

7-1 EUROCORR 2011 - Stockholm (Sweden) - Report

Appendix 1 provides the EUROCORR 2011 Report Form 1.

Dr. Ingegerd Annergren reported on the preliminary results of **EUROCORR 2011 in Stockholm** as follows:

4 Plenary Lectures, 402 Oral Presentations, 235 Posters, 5 main sponsors, 18 exhibitors. At the time of the meeting, 852 participants were registered from 51 countries.

The second edition of the President’s Evening was organised on Sunday night, after the General Assembly meeting.

7-2 ***EUROCORR 2012 – Istanbul (Turkey) - Progress with Arrangements***

EUROCORR 2012 will be held on **9 - 13 September 2012 in Istanbul**. The general theme will be **“A Safer World through better Corrosion Control”**.

Prof. Dr. A. Fuat Çakir reported on the preliminary arrangements for EUROCORR 2012.

The Congress venue has been changed for the Sheraton Istanbul Maslak Hotel and Congress Center, close to an underground station and located a 15 min subway ride away from the Taksim district where a variety of hotels are located.

The organisation of the congress has been entrusted to ZED (Congress organiser).

An invitation giving the schedule with the deadline for the submission of abstracts (10 February 2012) was distributed during EUROCORR 2011.

Appendix 2 contains the EUROCORR 2012 preliminary arrangements.

7-3 ***EUROCORR 2013 - Estoril (Portugal) - Report on Preliminary Arrangements***

EUROCORR 2013 will be held on **1 - 5 September 2013**, at the Estoril Congress Centre, near Lisbon starting on Sunday evening and organised by SPM. The general theme will be **“Corrosion control for a blue sky”**.

Mrs. Fátima Montemor reported on initial progress. **Appendix 3** provides the EUROCORR 2013 preliminary arrangements.

7-4 ***EUROCORR 2014 – Pisa (Italy) – Initial Progress Report***

EUROCORR 2014 will be held on **8 - 12 September 2014** in Pisa, Italy at the Palazzo dei Congressi. The general theme will be **“Improving Materials Durability: from Cultural Heritage to Industrial Applications”**.

Dr. Stefano Trasatti reported on behalf of AIM on the initial progress for EUROCORR 2014. The proposed dates have been maintained with the congress starting on Monday evening instead of the usual Sunday. The Congress Center and Hotels have been booked. The local organising and scientific committees will be defined soon.

7-5 ***EUROCORR 2015 - Call for Bids***

Members were reminded that bids to host **EUROCORR 2015** should be submitted in writing to the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer **by 31st December 2011** with a copy to the Frankfurt Office and the Paris Office.

Item 8 EFC Approval/Accreditation of Short Courses

Dr. Damien Féron reported that the STAC agreed to the proposal by Dr. Robert Cottis to formulate a database of the Corrosion Courses organised in Europe with the support of the EFC Member Societies as a first step. This work has been partly performed. Once this step is taken, the next step would be to assign EFC approval to the courses using a prescribed process involving the STAC and Working Party Chairmen.

It was reminded that, in the future, the term “Accreditation” would be replaced by another term such as “Approval” due to the fact that the word “Accreditation” is recognized as having more of an official meaning.

The approval to proceed with the proposed organization of “Short Courses” has been reaffirmed by the BoA. Consequentially, the EFC Bye-Laws need to be changed to specify that courses will be organised or approved by an EFC Member Society or a Working Party in order to qualify as an EFC-approved course.

It was suggested that possibly university credits could be given for courses held before or after Eurocorr conferences which would provide a good stimulus for university students to attend and participate more.

Item 9 EFC Events and Calendar of Events

BoA members approved the new EFC Event Application Form modified to eliminate the following clause:

“CONTRIBUTION TO EFC CENTRAL FUNDS: Please indicate levy to be charged per delegate for EFC central funds (*this is not mandatory but 5 or 10 Euros per delegate would be very much appreciated*)”.

and to substitute to it the clause: “*EFC-sponsored event organizers who have been assigned an EFC Event number will agree to offer a small discount to EFC Members attending the event upon presentation of their EFC Membership Card*”.

The new form is given as **Appendix 4**. It is available in the “restricted area” of the EFC website.

Appendix 4 of the Working Papers provided an update of forthcoming events in the EFC Calendar prepared by Juliet Ippolito. The board was reminded that EFC Calendar of Events also includes non-EFC-sponsored events in an attempt to draw outside interest to the EFC as a central source of information on corrosion events throughout the world.

BoA Members are also reminded that a Calendar of Events is regularly updated on the EFC website by Dechema.

Item 10 Any other Business

None.

Item 11 Date and Place of next BoA

The next BoA meeting will be held in Spring 2012, in Istanbul, hosted by EUROCORR 2012 organisers, in conjunction with the Papers Selection Meeting, at a time to be announced at a later date.
