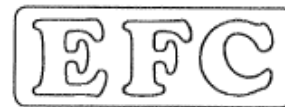

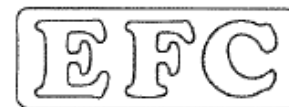

Treasurers report to the Board of Administrators - March 2011

1 Subscriptions

A summary of subscriptions for 2010 is attached. From these figures, the income to be shown in the 2010 accounts amounts to €35,491. This is slightly less than the budget for the year of €37,332 but I would expect to receive more subscriptions before the 2010 accounts are finalised.

2 Eurocorr levy

We have received €25,000 in respect of Eurocorr 2010 and this exceeds the budget of €17,640.

3 Book royalties

We do not have full details of the income due for the year.

4 Expenditure

I do not have full details of expenditure but I believe it will be less than the budget of €58,044. Paul McIntyre has been unable to do as much work because of his illness but I am expecting further invoices from him. Other costs also appear to be lower than budget.

5 Surplus for the year

We should exceed the budgeted surplus of €4,543 and may reach the surplus of €19,282 achieved in 2009.

6 Draft results

I expect to be able to complete draft accounts by the time of the BOA meeting and I will update you about the results.

The EUROCORR'2010 decided that the levy for 2010 will be 25.000 €, as it was a financially successful conference.

PERCEIVED REASONS FOR DISCREPANCIES BETWEEN THE ANTICIPATED AND ACTUAL NUMBERS OF DELEGATES:

In 2010 we had a very large gap between the numbers of registered participants and the number of delegates who really attended.

The reasons for this situation are the following:

1. Some of local (Russian) participants were not able to raise the necessary funds to pay their registration and travel expenses though they were very interested in participation.
2. We feel that abnormal heat and fires that occurred in Russia in the period preceding to EUROCORR'2010 had negatively influenced on the decision of some delegates.
3. The visa procedure that is unusual to most of the delegates, who yearly attend EUROCORR, unfortunately seemed too complicated to the delegates and though we did our best to make it as clear and smooth as possible, in the worst cases it was misunderstood completely and the delegates didn't apply for their visas in the consulates. The visa procedure had also made impossible late decisions to attend.

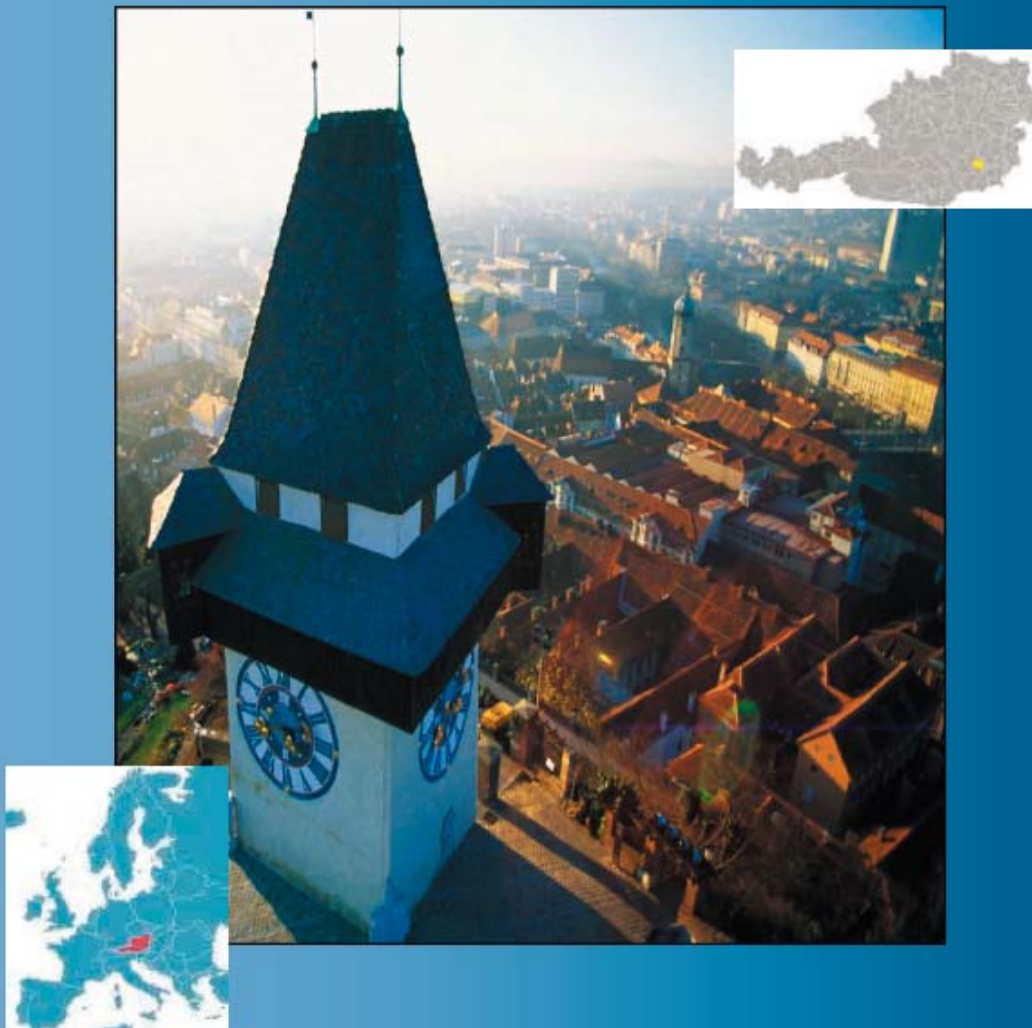
LESSONS FOR FUTURE ORGANISERS OF EUROCORR:

1. It is very important to control the registration of the authors and to find the ways to avoid no-shows.
2. The exhibition seems to be a very important part of the congress so every possible effort should be made to attract visitors to it during the whole conference. Some special events could be organized to encourage the delegates to devote more time and attention to the exhibition.

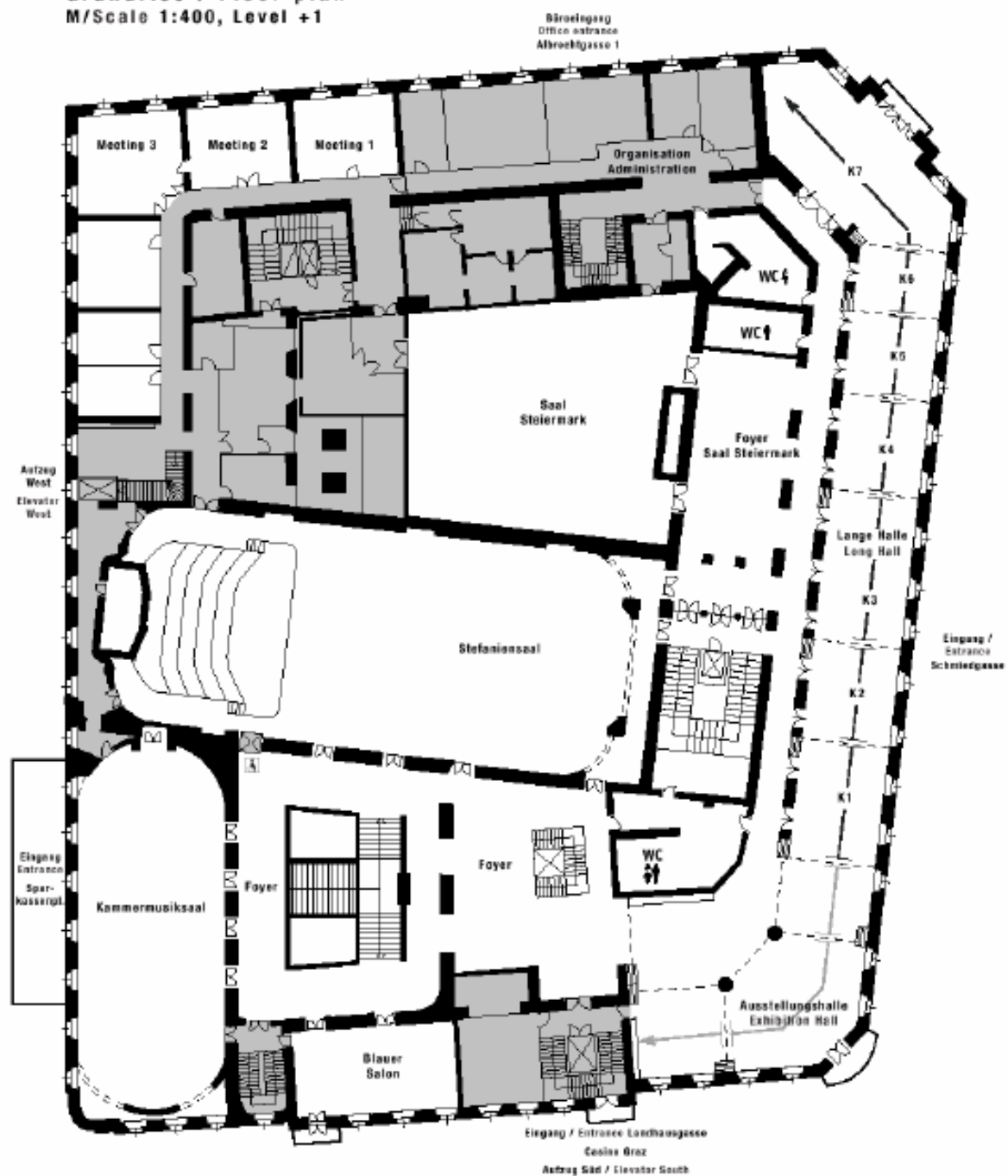

Venue: Pisa – Palazzo dei Congressi

Pisa's name derives from an Etruscan word meaning "outfall"—the outlet formed by a river as it flows into the sea. Every four years Pisa celebrates its maritime origins by re-enacting naval battles between the four historic republics (Pisa, Venice, Genoa and Amalfi) during the Historic Regata on the Arno River.

The Piazza dei Miracoli (Square of Miracles) is home to many of the city's most beautiful attractions. The baptistery shares the piazza with the imposing Camposanto (sacred burial ground) whose 43 blind arcades face the square. To the right of the Camposanto is the marble-covered cathedral, a masterpiece of Pisan Romanesque architecture built in the early 1600s. The famous Leaning Tower rises directly behind the cathedral.

Construction on the baptistery was initiated by architect Diotisalvi in 1152 and was not completed for another two hundred years. The baptistery houses Nicola Pisano's renowned marble pulpit. Fun fact: Stand on one side of the baptismal font and make a sound with your voice—note how one sound will echo in various tones throughout the baptistery.

During the Middle Ages the rounded Piazza dei Cavalieri was the civil and political centre of Pisa. The piazza is home to the Scuola Normale Superiore (Pisa Normal School) - Pisa has a centuries-old tradition as a university town - the Torre della Muda (made famous by Conte Ugolino's tale in Dante's *Inferno*) and the church of Santo Stefano dei Cavalieri.

The **Palazzo dei Congressi** of Pisa is a building with a distinctive semicircular shape, with trees and gardens. The construction consists of three floors (21 rooms from 10 up to 1000 seats). Suitable, for hosting any kind of event: congresses, conventions, road shows, trade shows and exhibitions.

Annex I

Getting to Pisa

The province of Pisa is formed of 39 municipalities and holds a prized position in the western part of Tuscany: it shares borders with the province of Lucca to the north, Florence to the east and north-east, Siena to the south-east, Grosseto to the south and Livorno and the Tyrrhenian Sea to the West.

This means that the province of Pisa is easily accessible by car along the autostrada (motorway) links and by the SGC FI-PI-LI superstrada (expressway). It can be reached by sea due to its proximity to the port of Livorno and by air thanks to the presence of the Galileo Galilei international airport

By air

Direct flights connect Galileo Galilei International Airport to various Italian cities and numerous international, European and other destinations.

Primarily **low cost airlines** operate to and from Pisa airport.

The airport is approximately 1 kilometre from the historical centre of the city of Pisa, at the “Pisa Aeroporto” exit of the Firenze–Pisa–Livorno (SGC FI-PI-LI) superstrada or freeway, and the A12 Genova-Rosignano autostrada or motorway.

A number of car hire companies service Pisa airport.

The city centre can be reached in just a few minutes by trains that connect the railway terminal of the airport with Pisa Centrale station.

Furthermore, an urban line (LAM Rossa) bus connects the airport to the Central Station and the centre of Pisa every 10 minutes. The urban bus terminus is located at the arrival side of the airport exit.

The taxi rank is also found at the airport exit - on the arrivals side. The Radio Taxi service (24 h) operates in the city of Pisa, telephone +39 (0)50 541600.

The Pisa Tourist Board information point is at the arrivals gate.

By rail

Pisa Centrale station is one of the principal regional and national railway junctions. Frequent trains run to Florence, Rome, Genoa and Lucca.

The station is at the southern edge of the city's historical centre, around one and a half kilometres from the airport and two hundred metres from the extra-urban bus terminal at Piazza Sant'Antonio. The taxi rank and the bus stop for urban routes direct to Piazza dei Miracoli, the airport and Cisanello hospital centre can be found outside the railway terminal. The station also provides a luggage storage service.

By bus

Long distance coaches • Long distance lines operate to connect Pisa to various Italian regions, chiefly central/southern Italy:

- Autolinee Simet, from Calabria (arrives at the Via Pietrasantina terminal).
- Autolinee Sena, from The Marche, Abruzzo, Basilicata, Calabria, Campania, Sicily, Puglia (arrives at the Via Pietrasantina terminal).
- Autolinee Moretti, from Basilicata.
- Autolinee Marozzi, from Basilicata and Puglia.

Direct buses to the airport • Pisa airport can be reached directly from Florence airport and central station. This service is provided by Terravision.

Extra-urban buses • Pisa is serviced by the transport company CPT - Compagnia Pisana Trasporti, covering most of the province, by Autolinee Lazzi transport company, connecting with Lucca and Viareggio, and by CLAP/Vaibus, which connects it to Lucca and Pietrasanta.

By tourist coach

Tourist coaches arriving to Pisa are required to stop at the Via Pietrasantina Car park, at the north entrance to the city. A permanent ban is in force in the town outskirts that prevents rests and stops and prohibits any type of coach from circulating on Sundays.

The car park is connected to Piazza dei Miracoli by a pedestrian route (10 minutes on foot) and is around 800 metres away. An urban line (LAM Rossa) and a shuttle bus service (Navetta C), both paid services, run frequently to the monumental district.

The daily rates, in force since the beginning of 2009, are as follows:

- Coaches of less than 8.5 metres in length: € 73
- Coaches exceeding 8.5 metres in length: € 109

The following services are available at the car park: public restrooms, public drinking fountain, fuel distributor, service station with coffee shop, cigarette outlet, refreshment area and souvenir outlet, Consorzio Turistico dell'Area Pisana booking centre.

By car

From Florence • Motorway A11 Firenze-Mare, exit at Pisa Nord, take the SS1 Aurelia travelling south to Pisa (approx. 6 km); alternatively Florence-Pisa-Livorno (SGC FI-PI-LI) expressway, exit at Pisa Nord-Est (for the Cisanello hospital centre and the eastern area), Pisa Aeroporto (for the airport and the central-southern area), Pisa Aurelia (for the Leaning Tower and the western area).

From Rome, Bologna • Motorway A1 to Florence, then Motorway A11, exit at Pisa Nord, then take the SS1 Aurelia travelling south to Pisa (approx. 6 km). Alternatively, follow the motorway A12-E80 from Rome to Civitavecchia, then the SS1-E80 Aurelia to Rosignano Marittimo, then rejoin the A12-E80 to Pisa (exit at Pisa Centro toll-booth).

From Genoa • Motorway A12 Genova-Rosignano, exit at Pisa Nord, then take the SS1 Aurelia travelling south to Pisa (approx. 6 km).

To access the historical centre • Most of the historical centre of Pisa falls within the Limited Traffic Zone (ZTL). Only authorised vehicles are permitted access to this zone; the entrances (electronic barriers) are monitored by 24 hour cameras and unauthorised access is sanctioned with a fine.

Temporary authorisation • Visitors staying in a hotel within the ZTL zone can have their hotel issue them with a temporary permit. Visitors with restricted mobility and in possession of a disabled sticker may be permitted entry by requesting authorisation in advance from the Polizia Municipale, tel. +39 050 910851/910810.
