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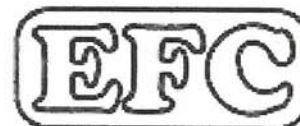

1. Discussions took place concerning the upcoming joint Greenbook publication EFC 63 entitled: *"The Corrosion Performance of Metals for the Marine Environment-A Basic Guide"* By WP 9 Marine Corrosion Chairman Ulf Kivisakk and contributors from NACE's STG 44. J. Ippolito advised that the manuscript was with the EFC's Greenbook series publisher Maney UK who were carrying out a final editing and proofreading of the book together with the authors, and that 200 copies were to be purchased and distributed to participants at an upcoming Marine Corrosion workshop.
2. C. Fowler reported on the good turnout of the previous day's joint EFC-NACE seminar on the *History, Development and Challenges of NCE MR0175/ISO 15156*. He feels that the seminar should be repeated at next year's EUROCORR 2012 and that everybody should have a "working document" in their possession for reference during the workshop. Consideration was given to holding this as a short course next year with possible NACE professional development hours.
3. This led to further discussions regarding the possibility of organizing short courses in other common EFC/NACE areas of interest such as Marine Corrosion. P. Marcus advised that the discussion of EFC-organized/accredited courses had been discussed at the previous day's BoA and STAC meeting and were being considered by the STAC Committee.
4. The organization of joint-sessions at EUROCORR Istanbul was discussed which would be on the topic of *Corrosion, Erosion and Corrosion Monitoring* with EFC's WP 13 Corrosion in Oil and Gas Production and NACE's own STG 61 "Inhibition - Corrosion and Scaling" and NACE'S Technology Exchange Group (TEG 374X) on "Oil and Gas Production Materials Information Exchange" on Sour Service.

5. Discussions regarding the topic of CO₂ Capture and Transformation took place with the planning of possible collaborative activities at EUROCORR 2012 on this important “hot topic”. S. McFarland advised that back at the EFC Board of Administrator’s meeting in March 2011 NACE had launched a task group on CO₂ C&T where he offered to be instrumental in setting up a joint workshop on this issue in order to seek common agreement in international standards. D. Feron advised that at the previous day’s Science and Technological Advisory Committee (STAC) meeting an EFC task force had been set up which will be led by Dr. Ralph Bassler of the BAM Federal Institute for Materials Research and Testing in Berlin. At this point S. McFarland and R. Bassler will be working together to organize this joint session at Eurocorr 2012 in Istanbul.
6. There was also discussion on the possibility of a NACE U.S. workshop or course that was less didactic in nature and more one consisting of various people getting up in front of the audience and recounting, exchanging and discussing their experiences with corrosion issues in the field in order to invite open discussion on common problems and solutions.
7. The World Corrosion Organization (WCO) was discussed and it was agreed that, as it is intended to be a political organization rather than a scientific society, one of its objectives is to lobby at the U.N. although it would likely be more effective in raising corrosion awareness if it was able to lobby at the highest government levels such as the U.S. Congress or the E.U. Parliament which, in turn, would give it a more clear-cut direction and purpose. The fact that it is U.N. endorsed doesn’t necessarily give it as much clout in the U.S. as it might in Europe where M. Schütze reported that its endorsement was very helpful to him in order to get funding support for corrosion research in Germany.

M. Schütze suggested that if it focuses on basic topics such as drinking water that are directly applicable to developing countries it could potentially capture the attention of agencies such as the World Health Organization and perhaps become better recognized and a more powerful political tool. He stated that he saw it as good label to be used for conferences and that we should think about how to profit from its NGO status.

Current president George Hays was discussed and B. Chalker advised that NACE currently does the marketing, secretarial support and financial work in-kind to contribute to its operating expenses.

M. Schütze suggested setting up a task force at NACE Salt Lake City in order to discuss its true potential and realistically achievable goals together. B. Chalker offered to talk to the president Wayne Burns at the upcoming ICC conference in Australia to see if he would support NACE and the EFC organizing a meeting in Salt Lake City next year.

8. Discussions took place regarding field application and B. Chalker clarified that NACE covers all facets of Corrosion and has a wide range of constituents including members from the Scientific, Government, Engineers and Technicians communities and that this mix is essential in order to meet NACE International’s mission which is to protect people, assets, and the environment from the effects of corrosion. EFC and NACE representatives each confirmed their willingness to collaborate harmoniously together so that each organization balances the other out with regards to geographical resources, distribution, representation and expertise that go beyond the confines of Europe and the U.S.

Scientific Secretary / Public Relations Officer's Report

September was an important month in that I participated in my first EUROCORR congress where I manned the EFC booth that was shared with Linda Goldberg, Director of NACE's Technical Activities, and over the 4 day period was able to learn about how NACE is organized and operates.

Also at EUROCORR, besides from greeting previous corrosion contacts in my new role as EFC Scientific Secretary/Public Relations Officer, I made a particular point of introducing myself to the non-European participants who gathered around the posters and attended the coffee breaks from countries such as Korea, Japan, Brazil, Colombia and Iran, and was able to inform them about the EFC. I followed up in writing with some of these contacts in order to generate their interest in eventually becoming an EFC member. In particular I have been corresponding with the contacts for the Chinese Society for Corrosion and Protection and the Corrosion Society of India as well as the Iranian Corrosion Society, three very important and active corrosion societies where alliance and eventual EFC membership could be very useful as it is my belief that the new growth for our society will come from ex-Europe/USA; in those developing countries who increasingly send young researchers abroad for post-graduate work and who see Europe as a convenient, neutral location from which to interact with the rest of the world in an exchange of corrosion-related interests.

The day before EUROCORR I attended my first STAC meeting and met all the STAC members and Working Party Chairmen for the first time and recorded the minutes for post-congress distribution. The meeting also gave me a first-hand opportunity to become aware of "hot" corrosion issues from the experts themselves such as corrosion in drinking water, CO₂ capture and transfer, geothermal energy and the keen interest in eventually organizing and offering corrosion courses. I also attended my first General Assembly Meeting on this day as well.

On the 5th of September I participated in the EFC-NACE Presidents' Meeting and met both NACE's Executive Director and Strategic Initiatives Director and was able to gain a better understanding of NACE's "corrosion culture" which appears to be quite different from that of the EFC and my own European-based experience which is mostly in the R&D sector. I took the minutes for that meeting and afterwards distributed them to those present.

Following EUROCORR I wrote up a post-congress cover letter to accompany the electronic link address of the hard-copy September newsletter which was sent out electronically for the first time. The purpose of this letter was to re-cap the success of EUROCORR 2011, promote EUROCORR 2012 and reinforce in peoples' minds the connection between the EFC and EUROCORR. The letter with the newsletter link address was sent out by EFC Frankfurt to their database of circa 2,500 corrosion contacts. Also throughout the year I have been continually forwarding contact names and e-mail addresses of corrosion-related professionals to Dechema to add to their database in an attempt to make it as comprehensive as possible as it is undoubtedly the most widespread means of disseminating information about the EFC and EUROCORR across the globe.

In November we welcomed 2 new members to the EFC, the Italian APCE *Associazione Protezione Contro le Corrosioni Elettrolitiche* (which is the Italian counterpart to France's CEFRAFOR) and ABRACO, the *Associação Brasileira de Corrosão*, our first Latin American member. These are 2 organizations that Marcel Roche had been soliciting for a number of years and it was very gratifying to "tie the knot" and get them on board and serves as an excellent example of how the EFC's working party chairman can tap into their own prestigious reputations and wide circle of corrosion contacts developed throughout their careers in order to bring other organizations on board as members with my follow-up and support.

I worked closely with a former contact from EADS/Airbus and assisted in soliciting abstracts from the aerospace industry and researchers, many of whom are E.U. Project partners in aerospace research for a newly formed Aerospace session to be held at EUROCORR 2012 which will hopefully be voted in as a new EFC Working Party on Corrosion in Aerospace following the workshop. This, also, was an excellent example of leveraging the EFC in that, being that E.U. project partners must disseminate and exploit their projects' research results, it did not take much to convince EADS that EUROCORR was the ideal forum to present their research results and eventually publish within the EFC series.

In my efforts to solicit for new members, I drew up a list of the benefits of being a EFC member which was presented at the President's Advisory Committee meeting in December in Paris. Most of the PAC gave their input to this list so that the advantages to EFC membership are more clearly defined and recognized by all in the efforts for increasing membership. I recorded the Action Items coming out of the PAC meeting and distributed them and then proceeded to take them with me in a visit to Dechema in February where I was able to sit down with Ines Honndorf and together we conferred, revised, clarified and updated the wording on various EFC forms and documents making them easier to understand and locate on the EFC website. We also finalized a new EFC-endorsed course application form and worked to establish a more efficient procedure for integrating new EFC members and give a clear-cut procedure for assigning delegates to the EFC working parties,

Since September 10 EFC numbers have been assigned to member-related corrosion events and are included in the Calendar of Events along with other corrosion-related events taking place everywhere in the world.

I also requested each WP Chairmen to submit their complete delegate members' e-mail addresses and forwarded these onto EFC Frankfurt to ensure that Dechema has the up-to-date e-mail listings of all working party members in their database.

I've been coordinating with the authors and Production Editor for Maney for publication of EFC 63 "The Corrosion Performance of Metals for the Marine Environment-A Basic Guide" by Working Party 9 and EFC 64 "Recommended Practice for Corrosion Management of Pipelines in Oil & Gas Production and Transportation" by EFC WP 13, which were displayed and put up for sale at the recent NACE meeting in Salt Lake City.

In January I coordinated with the Australian Corrosion Association in their request for the 4 EUROCORR plenary speakers' papers to be republished their bi-monthly publication "Corrosion & Materials" where they will give full acknowledgment to the EFC and to EUROCORR where the lectures were originally presented.

I've introduced and integrated our 4 new Working Party Chairmen effective January 1st on all WP listings which are as follows:

- WP 7 - Corrosion Education: Andreas Heyn (replacing Bob Cottis) from the Institute of Materials and Joining Technology at Magdeburg University, Berlin Germany,
 - WP 10 - Microbial Corrosion: Turid Liengen (replacing Rolf Gubner) who is the Principal Engineer for Material Corrosion at Statoil ASA in Norway,
 - WP 13 - Corrosion in Oil and Gas Production: Michel BONIS (replacing Thierry Chevrot) who is the Technology/Corrosion Discipline advisor, of Total SA in Pau, France
- and
- WP 16 - Cathodic Protection: Jérôme Crouzillac (replacing Marcel Roche) of BAC Corrosion Control in Voisins Le Bretonneux, France

After a full year working for the EFC one of the goals that I envision as its PR Officer is to establish a sharper identity and more clearly-defined role for our federation; much of which can be done through daily correspondence and the development of close working relationships. Fortunately today with the Internet this is entirely possible. One of the biggest challenges I face is the fact that most of the EFC staff and members work on a voluntary basis (as opposed to NACE's circa 20 full-time employees) and therefore, each has his or her own personal and professional reasons for taking on the added EFC responsibilities. I feel that once I can get a better understanding of their motivations, it will become easier to align the EFC's activities with those of its members' professional goals and duties which will give an added incentive to becoming more committed to the EFC which, in turn, will provide more recognition of the EFC's value to their employers. EUROCORR seems to be the "jewel in the crown" of the EFC and I believe that there are possibilities to make it an even more powerful vehicle for extended interaction with the world corrosion community. Finally, I feel that there exists much exploitable opportunity in the educational and publishing end and that it is critical that the EFC establish a strong relationship with a publisher with a strong marketing and sales division in materials science. This would provide more compatibility - rather than competition - with other regional corrosion federations and eventually strengthen our science-to-industry ratio of activity providing more cohesiveness among the EFC's Working parties and greater incentive to becoming an EFC member. The challenge ahead is to balance the *bonhomie* of a traditional, serious scientific society with the competitive and cost-driven needs of industry.

Future publishing arrangements for the EFC green book series

Following our meeting in Paris I consulted with my colleagues in the UK, Mark Hull and Dr Emma Leighton, the Journals Manager and Managing Editor of our materials science titles respectively, since they have been mostly closely involved with the publication of the journal *Corrosion Science Engineering & Technology (CEST)*. We value, and are keen to strengthen, the collaboration between *CEST* and EFC, which we believe has been mutually beneficial.

Having said this, to be direct, I can fairly say that Maney no longer wishes to publish the green book series, for several reasons:

- These are the only new materials science books we publish, so without the necessary volume of new titles, international distribution and promotion, we simply cannot sell enough of the books to achieve the educational or commercial aims of the EFC, or even recover our own costs. Nor have we been able to involve the member societies of the EFC in promoting the books to their own members.
- The variable format of the books, and the unpredictable schedule, would make any publishing programme difficult. The range from conference proceedings (and we see no merit in re-publishing papers that have already been published) to technical manuals makes it hard to establish a consistent image for the series.
- Maney simply cannot afford within the current value of sales the enhancements to the contract you proposed (e.g. colour images in every book, higher royalties, more free copies). Indeed, we have strong reservations about the future of the printed book in this context.

In addition, since the retirement of Paul McIntyre, IoM³ itself has no long-term plans for involvement in the EFC series and we need to reflect the interests of our publishing partner.

Publication in *CEST*

Although I know you said that industrial members of the EFC value journal publication less highly it is a far better way, through ISI and Scopus citation and online platforms, of ensuring the international availability of the contents than distributing books. *CEST* is of course an

official journal of the EFC and we would like to keep that distinction and continue to publish in the journal material from EuroCORR sessions and EFC workshops. In many cases, we would argue, publication of a theme issue of *CEST* provides the opportunity for more effective, focused coverage of a topic, with the added value conferred by peer review. It would be possible to commit to regular publication of theme issues based on EFC activities, although the acceptance of any proposal for an issue must be at the discretion of the Editor.

Future arrangements

As I said when we met, Maney will not insist that the EFC complies with the full term of the publishing agreement (to 2013) if it wishes to transfer its publishing arrangements elsewhere sooner. I know that Martin Woodhead is interested in the series and I do not mind if you wish to contact him before your BoA meeting in March.

We would hope to work with another publisher so that the “one-stop shop” for the books, both in print and electronically, can be maintained by them.

Maney shall of course publish all books in progress (nos 62 and 64 go to press this month), unless you prefer otherwise, but I do not believe it makes sense for us to commence work on any more titles (e.g. the WP21 book on corrosion of artefacts) due later this year.

Personally, I feel that the future for this material is electronic publishing, rather than print, and that a means has to be found of doing so efficiently.

I hope this is sufficient for the BoA to discuss but I do feel that the time has come to put an end to a publishing arrangement which is disappointing to us both and concentrate instead of what is working very well, the dissemination of EFC material through *CEST*.
