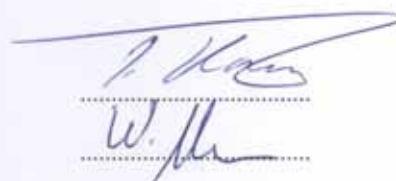

UNCONFIRMED MINUTES OF THE EFC BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS

Item 01 Opening of the meeting

Prof. Philippe Marcus, President of the EFC and Chairman of the meeting, opened the meeting and welcomed the delegates present (see attendance list).

Item 02 Apologies for Absence

Apologies had been received from the following:

Item 1 Approval of the Agenda and Adoption of the Minutes of the last Meeting

1-1 The proposed agenda was approved.

1-2 The minutes of the previous meeting in Istanbul (27 March 2012) were approved.

Item 2 Report on STAC Activities

Dr. Damien Féron, STAC Chairman, reported that the meeting of the morning had been very fruitful with large attendance and much discussion. He reported on progress in the STAC, as follows:

The Task Force on CO₂ – Corrosion in Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) applications, chaired by Dr. Ralph Bässler will continue its work with the scope of a possible transformation into a Working Party next year.

The BoA was informed of the modification by the STAC that the name of Working Party 7 would be modified to “**Corrosion Education**”. The BoA stressed the importance of this Working Party and is anticipating a strong resurgence by the new Chairman Prof. Dr. Andreas Heyn.

The STAC has approved the request of **Working Party 18 Tribo-Corrosion for** EFC financial support in the amount of €1,000 as documented by a report of the Working Party’s activities. The BoA agreed to this proposal.

For the first time, and following an initiative of Mrs Juliet Ippolito, a full day **Workshop on Aerospace Corrosion** is organised during EUROCORR 2012 by Mr. Theo Hack (EADS). The STAC recommended launching a new Working Party on this topic in the near future.

Following an action placed on the STAC to implement a “**EUROCORR Exhibition Advisory Board**”, the STAC Chairman informed the BoA that Mr. Don Harrop has agreed to chair this advisory board.

The BoA approved this proposal. A report on preliminary proposals should be presented during the next BoA spring Meeting in Lisbon.

EFC Awards: the STAC elected the members of the Juries for the EFC Award and Poster Prize for the Best Poster at EUROCORR 2012 as follows:

Jury for the EFC Medal 2013:

Dr. Damien FÉRON, France, as Chairman of the STAC and of the Jury;
Dr. Wolfram FÜRBEETH, Germany, new Chairman of the WP14 on Coating instead of Prof. Dr. Andrea HEYN, Germany, due to other commitments (the change has occurred since the BoA Meeting);
Ms Turid LIENGEN, Norway;
Dr. Arjan MOL, Netherlands.

Jury for the Poster Prize 2012:

Dr. Damien FÉRON, France, as Chairman of the STAC and of the Jury;
Mr. Jérôme CROUZILLAC, France;
Prof. Dr. Andrea HEYN, Germany.

EFC Website: the STAC requested that DECHEMA introduce a page on the website on “News” for highlighting the important matters taking place within the Working Parties?

In addition, the STAC requested to introduce **rules on how to become a Working Party Member** together with a link to apply for that.

Rules for EFC Awards Winners: Following a STAC request, the BoA approved to include in the EUROCORR Organisers’ Agreement rules to provide free registration for the winner(s) of that year’s Award(s).

Item 3 Administrative Matters

3-1 EFC Presidency and Vice-Presidency

Prof. Philippe Marcus’s second term as EFC President will end in 2012. The BoA will recommend to the General Assembly (GA) the following day that the current Vice-President, Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, be the new EFC President effective 1st January 2013. The BoA accepted delaying the turnover date to after EUROCORR in order to ensure a better transition.

At this time, it was also necessary for the BoA to select a new Vice-President for appointment by the GA. At the President’s Advisory Committee (PAC) meeting which took place on 3rd July 2012 in Paris, an action was placed on the President to identify potential candidates for this position.

The EFC President proposed Mrs. Fátima Montemor from Portugal. **Appendix 1** contains her CV. Prof. Dr. Bernd Isecke emphasized that, as the VP is usually next in line to succeed the current EFC President, the nominated VP has to be well established and well known internationally. In addition, he added that the perceived role of the President is to manage the EFC and to improve the involvement of industry in EFC activities.

Prof. Philippe Marcus explained that Mrs. Fátima Montemor has accepted this challenge and that she has the support of her institution.

As she is not presently a member of the BoA, in accordance with the EFC Bye-Laws, the BoA approved the nomination of Mrs. Fátima Montemor and her cooptation as new BoA Member. Her candidacy will be presented for election to the GA the following day from the 1st January 2013.

3-2 EFC Honorary Treasurer

Following a meeting of the EFC President and the UK Office (Bernie Rickinson, Ray Milbank and Don Harrop), on June 29, 2012 in London, IOM³ confirmed that they will ensure the continuity of the Honorary Treasurer position when Mr. Ray Milbank steps down from this position.

The EFC President reminded the BoA that the EFC has more than one year's operating budget in surplus and that all the EFC accounts have now been converted into euros and that the subscriptions are billed and collected in euros, as are the expenses.

Unfortunately, Prof. Philippe Marcus was advised that earning interest on EFC reserved funds is not possible due to the euro being a foreign currency deposited in a UK bank account.

Mr. Antoine Pourbaix reminded everyone that a small amount of money is still in a Belgium bank due to the fact that the EFC is registered in Belgium.

3-3 Separation of the Positions of Scientific Secretary and Public Relation Officer

At the initiative of the Frankfurt Office, during its last meeting, the PAC reconsidered the position of Scientific Secretary/Public Relation Officer (PRO) and separating the one position into two separate positions was proposed.

It was emphasized that the Scientific Secretary should have a scientific background in corrosion and that the Public Relations Officer (PRO) should be only oriented to marketing actions to increase the number of EFC members, particularly Affiliate members. The role is envisaged to develop the external communication of the EFC.

During the last PAC meeting, an action was placed on the Frankfurt Office to prepare the new job descriptions. These proposals were distributed and discussed during the meeting. Both positions would be one-year contracts renewed every year. In addition, it was emphasized that these two positions would have to cooperate with each other to develop and promote the EFC activities.

For example, the EFC Newsletter would be prepared by the PRO with the input of the Scientific Secretary based upon the information coming from Working Party activities as provided by the Chairmen under the Scientific Secretary's coordination.

It was agreed that the Frankfurt Office would review the two job descriptions with the help of Mr. Don Harrop before publishing them on the EFC Website, and circulate them to the EFC Members for advertising on their own Websites.

The BoA approved this decision (unanimously less one abstention) for recommendation to the GA's approval before advertising.

Mrs Juliet Ippolito will have a priority for the new position of Public Relation Officer (if she decides to apply).

3-4 Status of Applications for EFC Membership

The Frankfurt Office reported that the BoA and the GA approved by email process the application of new members:

- ABRACO (Associação Brasileira de Corrosão), Brasil as International Member;
- APCE (Association for Protection against Electrolytic Corrosion), Italy as European Member.

3-5 Procedure for new EFC members to assign delegates to Working Parties

Mrs. Juliet Ippolito and the Frankfurt Office were requested to create a document advising new EFC Members of the services and benefits available to them as well as how to proceed to assign delegates to EFC's 19 Working Parties. Appendix 1 of the Working Papers contains this document.

The BoA agreed and decided to have this document sent to both new and existing EFC Member Societies and will recommend this proposal to the GA.

Item 4 Interaction with other Organisations

4-1 EFC/NACE Collaboration.

Appendix 2 of the Working papers provided the minutes of the meeting which took place between EFC and NACE on March 13, 2012, during the NACE Conference in Salt Lake City.

A meeting between EFC and NACE was scheduled to take place on Tuesday, September 11, 2012, at lunch time. A report will be presented during the next Spring BoA Meeting in Lisbon.

4-2 World Corrosion Organisation

Prof. Michael Schütze presented the progress on EFC/WCO collaboration.

Everyone was reminded that the main objective of the WCO is to increase corrosion awareness in industry and academia by way of celebrating World Corrosion Awareness Day on 24 April of each year. A project for a second "White Book" has been launched on Drinking Water Systems in developing countries where corrosion is a major concern for water storage and distribution.

Preparations will be underway for different workshops around the world. An EFC-WCO Workshop on this topic was to be organized by Dr. Wilhelm Erning of WP 20 during EUROCORR 2012 but did not materialize due to the relevance of the abstracts received.

4-3 ICC

A report on recent ICC activities has been presented by Mr. Antoine Pourbaix.

Mr. Antoine Pourbaix advised that he had stepped down from the Organising Committee. 900 to 1.000 delegates participated in the combined 18th ICC-ACA congress in Perth, Australia, November 20 to 24, 2011. The 19th ICC congress will be held in Jeju, South Korea in November 2014.

The 20th ICC congress may be organized in Europe in 2017. The European bidders are strongly recommended to propose candidatures based on dates which will not interfere with EUROCORR 2017 (e.g. May or June).

4-4 European Commission

The EFC has been approached to participate in the E.U. Research programme on coatings called "Barrier Plus Research Project". The role of the EFC would be to participate as advisor of the research consortium.

BoA Members have been informed that the EFC is now registered with the European Commission (Research Executive Agency) as a “non-profit private entity” partner in this Project with the PIC number 953428327 and that the EFC can now participate in EU programmes.

Appendix 3 of the Working Papers provided information on the “Barrier Plus” Programme, the official confirmation of the EFC registration and the information about the nomination of an EFC Legal Entity Appointed Representative (LEAR) with its role and tasks.

The BoA was requested to nominate an EFC representative to perform certain tasks in the context of the legal entity on behalf of the EFC.

As this Research Program pertains to Coatings, Prof. Philippe Marcus proposed that the LEAR representative would be the Chairman of the Working Party 14, Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, who will also be EFC President from next year.

Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi agreed and this proposal was accepted by the BoA for recommendation to the GA.

Item 5 EFC Activities and Projects

5-1 *Report of the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer*

Appendix 4 of the Working Papers presented the report of the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer, covering activities since the March BoA meeting.

The BoA approved the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer’s Report.

5-2 *EFC Publications*

5-2-1 *EFC Book Series*

EFC STAC Chairman, Dr. Damien Féron, reported on the progress in the preparation of the EFC Book Series.

Two books are planned in the EFC series:

- "Corrosion and conservation of cultural heritage metals", by the WP 21 (Corrosion of Archaeological and Historical Artifacts), planned next October;
- “Stress corrosion cracking of nickel base alloys”, by WP4 (Nuclear corrosion), planned at end of 2012.

The Working Party 10 on Microbial Corrosion is presently preparing a publication written from a summer school which took place last year.

For quite a number of years, the EFC Greenbook series has been edited by Maney, Publishing U.K. The current EFC/Maney agreement expires in 2013 and Maney has notified the EFC that they have taken the decision to no longer be the official publisher of the EFC Series as they are no longer interested in publishing hardcover books. They advised that they would like to terminate the contract before the February 2013 agreement expiration however it was left to the EFC's

discretion whether they wanted to end the agreement earlier or let it continue up to the expiration date.

Dr. Damien Féron and the EFC President reported on progress with their contacts taken with Woodhead Publishers (Cambridge, England) following BoA decision to find a new editor.

Following different phases of the negotiation, the decision was taken based upon the most favourable contractual conditions for the EFC Publications. It is confirmed that Woodhead Publishing based in Cambridge, England, would offer support in assist the Working Party Chairmen in editing their work and that they would require neither a minimum number of books to be published annually nor a minimum number of pages in each book. In addition, the latest requests made by the EFC have been granted, including EFC Royalties increase from 10 to 11 %.

The BoA approved the new publisher's contract for recommendation to the GA that the EFC President sign it without delay, effective from the date of signature. **Appendix 2** provides the EFC/Woodhead Publishers' signed agreement.

An action was placed on the Frankfurt Office to announce the new EFC publisher on the EFC Website as soon as possible.

Woodhead Publishers and Maney will come to an agreement for any pending Greenbook manuscripts in existence.

5-2-2 EFC Electronic Newsletter

The BoA Members were reminded that the third EFC e-Newsletter, prepared by Mrs. Juliet Ippolito, was circulated to over 2.500 people by DECHEMA for the occasion of the WCO Corrosion Awareness Day on 24 April 2012, an initiative of the WCO.

5-2-3 EFC Newsletter

The hardcopy Newsletter N° 20 have been prepared by Mrs. Juliet Ippolito, the Scientific Secretary / Public Relations Officer, and was distributed on the occasion of EUROCORR 2012.

5-2-4 Partnerships with EFC Journals

Dr. Roman Bender reported that the publications in "Materials and Corrosion" are based on the information provided by the Working Parties. The Working Party Chairmen are reminded to provide information to him for eventual publication..

Mr. Marcel Roche reminded everyone that at the March 2012 BoA Meeting approval was given to a partnership between the French journal "Matériaux et Technique" and the EFC.

An action is placed on the Frankfurt Office to introduce the corresponding link on the EFC Website.

He also proposed that the Scientific Secretary organise and coordinate the supply of relevant information from the EFC Working Party Chairmen towards all the "EFC Journals".

During the previous BoA, Prof. Mario Ferreira had requested the possibility to accept as “EFC-endorsed Journals” journals that are published in European Countries other than those hosting the 3 secretariats.

Following discussions at the July PAC meeting, it was recommended that the BoA create a Task Force (TF) under the leadership of Lorenzo Fedrizzi.

This TF will define the rules, rights and duties which would be implemented for such publishing partnerships including, for example, use of the EFC logo on the front page, partnership with an EFC Member Society, restrictions on the scientific and technical contents, review process, information on EFC activities, etc.

The BoA approved the creation of this TF, under the leadership of Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, and requested a proposal by next Spring’s BoA Meeting.

The BoA Members were invited to send any idea or question to Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi to be examined by this TF.

5-3 EFC Website

The BoA members are reminded of the login and password, which allows them direct access to the restricted area of the website:

Login: efc-boa
Password: edinburgh

Dr. Roman Bender presented the status on the latest improvements to the EFC Website including a more modern appearance and some new, more efficient functions. He also reported that, due to the change of Working Party Chairmen, some Working Party pages had been updated to reflect this.

During the March BoA, the conditions for access to the restricted areas of the Working Parties web pages were discussed and an action was placed on the PAC to clarify this item. Following discussions at the July PAC meeting it was recommended that STAC Members/WP Chairpersons grant access exclusively to Working Party delegates of EFC Member Societies (including Affiliate Members, which could be a good way to develop this category of membership, especially for countries where no EFC Member Society(ies) exist).

The STAC Chairman reported on the discussions which took place at the STAC meeting. Two positions were expressed:

- to restrict the access to the EFC Member Societies;
- to give access to all Working Party Members.

This topic is not addressed in the Bye-Laws as access to the Working Parties restricted areas not mentioned.

The BoA concluded for the time being to leave the decision to each Working Party Chairman.

This topic has to be kept in mind when the Bye-Laws are to be revised.

Item 6 Finance: Honorary Treasurer’s Report

In the absence of the Honorary Treasurer, the EFC President, Prof. Philippe Marcus, presented the EFC Financial Report which is contained the Appendix 6 of the Working Papers.

He emphasized the healthy budget which has a surplus of circa €20,000, and reserves of more than one year of the EFC's annual budget, allowing for the increase of some expenses (e.g. up to €8,000 for publicity in 2013 budget).

The annual financial statement for 2011 has been approved by the BoA.

At its July meeting in Paris, the PAC discussed the best method to encourage Member Societies who are not in good standing on payment of their membership subscriptions, to pay their membership dues. The London Office will send a letter signed by the EFC President to these societies requesting that they either pay their back membership dues at their earliest convenience or re-state their intent to remain an EFC Member Society, citing the membership subscription rules as specified in the EFC Bye-Laws.

The BoA approved the EFC Budget for 2013 including a provision for the Presidential Dinner, but an action was placed for the next PAC Meeting to evaluate its pertinence. The proposal of Dr. Damien Féron to increase the Scientific Secretary and PRO travel expenses has been considered but without any change in the present budget.

BoA Members approved the Honorary Treasurer's Report.

The EFC President, Prof. Philippe Marcus, suggested launching a new Strategic Group to consider the future of EFC.

Item 7 EUROCORR Series: 2012 to 2016

7-1 EUROCORR 2012 - Istanbul (Turkey) - Report

Prof. Dr. A.F. Cakir reported on the preliminary results of **EUROCORR 2012 in Istanbul** (see **Appendix 3**).

At the date of the meeting, 655 delegates were registered and 778 abstracts were submitted from 56 countries.

395 Oral lectures are scheduled to be presented in 8 to 11 parallel sessions. The exhibition contains 40 booths.

7-2 EUROCORR 2013 - Estoril (Portugal) - Progress with Arrangements

EUROCORR 2013 will be held on **1 - 5 September 2013**, at the Estoril Congress Centre, near Lisbon, starting on Sunday evening and will be organized by SPM. The general theme will be **"Corrosion control for a blue sky"**.

Mrs. Fátima Montemor reported on the progress with arrangements for EUROCORR 2013 (see **Appendix 4**).

The EFC President suggested that the website, presented by Prof. J. Fernandes, clearly indicates that EUROCORR is the annual Congress of the EFC and to remove the NACE logo as NACE is not a sponsor of EUROCORR nor is it involved in its organization, and the EFC logo is not the NACE corrosion Congress announcement. The BoA approved this suggestion.

7-3 EUROCORR 2014 - Pisa (Italy) - Report on Preliminary Arrangements

EUROCORR 2014 will be held on **8 - 12 September 2014** in Pisa, Italy at the Palazzo dei Congressi. The general theme will be **"Improving Materials Durability: from Cultural Heritage to Industrial Applications"**.

Mrs. Paula Bassani reported on the preliminary arrangements for EUROCORR 2014 (see **Appendix 5**).

The Italian organisers added new conference rooms following a partnership (to be confirmed) with the University and emphasised that more than 1.000 hotel rooms are available around the Congress Center.

7-4 EUROCORR 2015 - Graz (Austria) - Initial Progress Report

EUROCORR 2015 will be held on **6 - 10 of September 2015** in **Graz**, Austria. The general theme will be **“Earth, Fire, Water, Air, Corrosion happens everywhere”**.

Prof. Gregor Mori reported on the initial progress for EUROCORR 2015 (see **Appendix 6**). 700 to 900 delegates are expected.

7-5 EUROCORR 2016 - Call for Bids

BoA Members were reminded that bids to host **EUROCORR 2016** should be submitted in writing to the Frankfurt Office **by 31st December 2012** with a copy to the Scientific Secretary / Public Relation Officer and the Paris Office.

7-6 Minimum Amount of the Levy for EUROCORR Conferences

The question of the amount that EUROCORR Conference organizers contribute to the EFC Budget was raised by the EFC President during the PAC meeting last July in Paris.

An analysis of the levies for the 5 recent EUROCORRs, given as Appendix 8 of the Working Papers, shows that the figure of € 10,000, which is presently the minimum levy specified in the EUROCORR Agreement signed by the local organisers, should be revised.

In fact, the minimum EUROCORR levy allocated to the EFC budget since the last 5 editions was around € 20,000.

The PAC Members proposed to increase this minimum levy amount to € 20,000, starting with EUROCORR 2016, with a deposit amount of € 10,000.

A BoA Member remarked that this proposal could be a disadvantage for the smaller European countries who are outside the Eurozone to bid for the organisation of future EUROCORR Conferences.

The EFC President emphasized that the main objective for increasing the EUROCORR levy is to maintain a professional quality for future EUROCORRs and proposed that the deposit payment could be split with €5,000 at the signature of the EUROCORR Agreement and the second part of €5,000 after early registration deadline.

This proposal was agreed by the BoA following a vote (9 in favour, 2 against) for recommendation to the General Assembly.

Subject to GA approval, the EUROCORR Agreement will be updated by the Frankfurt Office.

7-7 Methods to increase the number of International Exhibitors

The STAC Chairman reported on the discussions during the Istanbul STAC meeting concerning the implementation of a **“EUROCORR Exhibition Advisory Board”** made

up of local EUROCORN organizers and Working Party Chairmen, in order to increase the presence of international exhibitors at future EUROCORN conferences.

As already explained in the above Item 2, Mr. Don Harrop has accepted to chair a "EUROCORN Exhibition Advisory Board".

BoA thanked Mr. Don Harrop for taking on this challenge and asked him to report on preliminary proposals during the next BoA spring Meeting in Lisbon.

Item 8 EFC Approval of Short Courses

BoA Members were reminded of the existing STAC Agreement specifying that Corrosion Courses can be organized in Europe with the support of the EFC Member Societies, and that EFC endorsement will be given to courses through the assigning of an EFC Corrosion Course number.

During its last meeting, the PAC agreed that it would not be necessary to modify the EFC By-Laws to specify that courses must be proposed by an EFC Member Society or a Working Party in order to qualify as an EFC-endorsed course, due to the fact that the corresponding item already exists under the general term of "EFC Events", article 15.

The process for approval of Short Courses will be the responsibility of the new Chairman of WP 7 Corrosion Education, Andreas Heyn.

Appendix 9 of the Working Papers provided the draft of a standardized form previously proposed by Mrs. Juliet Ippolito for EFC Member Societies to publicize their short corrosion courses on the EFC website as a service to members.

As no changes were proposed, the BoA approved this standardized form for recommendation to the GA.

Item 9 EFC Events and Calendar of Events

Appendix 10 of the Working Papers provided an update of forthcoming events in the EFC Calendar.

BoA Members were reminded that the Calendar of Events is regularly updated on the EFC website by Dechema.

Everyone was reminded that the EFC Calendar of Events also includes non-EFC-sponsored events in an attempt to draw outside interest to the EFC as a central source of information on corrosion events throughout the world.

An application form is available for the BoA Members to apply for an EFC Event Number under the "Events" section of the EFC website.

Item 10 Any other Business

None.

Item 11 Date and Place of next BoA

The next BoA meeting will be held in Spring 2013, in Lisbon, hosted by EUROCORN 2013 organisers, in conjunction with the Papers Selection Meeting, at a time to be announced at a later date.

EFC/Woodhead Publishers' signed Agreement

Publishing Agreement between the European Federation of Corrosion and Woodhead Publishing Limited

This AGREEMENT is made on 9 September 2012 2012 between the European Federation of Corrosion (hereinafter called the EFC), whose registered office in the United Kingdom is The Institute of Materials, Minerals and Mining, 1 Carlton House Terrace, London SW1Y 5DB, United Kingdom, and their successors and assigns, and Woodhead Publishing Limited (hereinafter called Woodhead), whose registered office is 80 High Street, Sawston, Cambridge CB22 3HJ, United Kingdom, and their successors and assigns.

WHEREAS

- The EFC is the owner of a book series entitled 'European Federation of Corrosion Publications' (hereinafter called the Series).
- The EFC wishes to contract the publishing, sale and distribution of new and existing volumes in the Series to Woodhead.

1 Rights granted

The EFC grants to Woodhead the exclusive publishing rights to publish, sell and distribute new volumes in the Series in book form and in all other forms, digital, electronic, software, audio, visual or otherwise (whether currently existing or which hereafter may be invented), and in all languages, throughout the world, and to negotiate the sale or lease of translation, serial, broadcasting, television, video or other rights in new volumes in the Series.

2 The Series

The EFC and Woodhead agree to retain the title of the Series as 'European Federation of Corrosion Publications', unless otherwise decided by the EFC. All manuscripts offered by the EFC or any of its Working Parties to Woodhead shall be considered as new volumes in the Series. The subject matter, content and authorship or editorship of volumes in the Series shall be the sole responsibility of the EFC. Subject to Clauses 4 and 5, Woodhead undertakes to publish all manuscripts supplied by the EFC for publication as new volumes in the Series.

3 Copyright

The copyright in the title and content of the Series and all volumes published in the Series is vested in the EFC. Each new volume in the Series will include a copyright notice which will read: ©(year of publication) European Federation of Corrosion. Copyright in the typographical arrangement of all new volumes published by Woodhead in the Series is vested in Woodhead.

4 Presentation of manuscripts for new volumes in the Series

The EFC shall be responsible for compiling manuscripts for new volumes in the series. The EFC undertakes to circulate Woodhead's guidelines on the presentation of manuscript material to the Chairs of its Working Parties and to the editors or authors compiling manuscripts for new volumes in the Series, and will use its best endeavours to ensure editors and authors preparing manuscripts in the Series adhere to these guidelines. The EFC will (to the best of its ability) deliver manuscripts and illustrations to Woodhead in accordance with Woodhead's guidelines on the presentation of

manuscript material. Woodhead is entitled to reject any manuscript which is incomplete or fails to meet its guidelines for the presentation of manuscript material, in which case the EFC undertakes to revise and resubmit the manuscript to the appropriate standard.

5 Copyright material in manuscripts for new volumes in the Series

The EFC is responsible for ensuring that all volumes in the Series submitted for publication to Woodhead are original works and do not infringe any existing copyrights. The EFC is responsible for obtaining at its own expense written permission from the relevant copyright holder for use of any material in a manuscript in which the EFC does not own the copyright. The EFC is also responsible for ensuring that any manuscripts submitted to Woodhead do not contain any pirated, libellous or other unlawful matter.

6 Copyediting queries and proofs

The EFC undertakes to ensure that editors and authors of manuscripts submitted to Woodhead respond to copyediting queries and read proofs within the timeframes required by Woodhead to ensure publication on schedule as set out in Clause 7.

7 Publication times for new volumes in the Series

Subject to Clauses 4, 5 and 6, Woodhead undertakes to publish all new volumes in the Series at its own expense and, unless prevented by war, strikes, lock-outs, or by any other circumstances beyond its control, within 6 months of acceptance of a complete and acceptable manuscript, unless otherwise mutually agreed.

8 Format and quality of new volumes in the Series

Woodhead agrees to publish new volumes in colour if requested by the EFC. New volumes will be published in either cased or paperback binding, depending on the extent of each volume. Woodhead will maintain the high standard of production with new titles in the Series that it achieves in its other publications in materials science. Woodhead also undertakes to respect the existing design and layout of the Series.

9 Pricing and promotion

Woodhead will have entire control over the pricing, promotion and terms of sale of new volumes published in the Series.

10 Royalty

Woodhead undertakes to pay the EFC the following royalty in respect of sales of new volumes in the Series published by Woodhead:

- 11% of the invoiced value of books sold, exclusive of postage and packing, and after any value added tax has been paid in respect of sales
- 11% of the income received from sales of the whole or part of any volume in the Series published by Woodhead in electronic form, , exclusive of postage and packing, and after any value added tax has been paid in respect of sales (including, but not limited to, sales from

electronic access to volumes authorised by Woodhead, and electronic transmission of content to customers)

- 11% of the income received by Woodhead from sales of volumes by third parties licensed by Woodhead to store or sell volumes in the Series in printed or electronic form

Royalties will be paid annually within three months of the Publisher's accounting reference date. No royalties shall be paid if the total annual royalty is less than £25.00 (twenty-five pounds), in which case royalties will be accrued until the amount exceeds £25 (twenty-five pounds).

The Publishers undertake, on reasonable notice from the EFC's accountants, auditors or other authorised agents, to permit the same to examine Woodhead's accounts relating to the sales of volumes in the Series for the purpose of establishing the royalties to which the EFC is entitled.

11 Complimentary copies

Woodhead agrees to dispatch the following complimentary copies of new volumes in the Series on publication:

- One complimentary copy of each new volume in the Series to each of the following officials in the EFC: the President of the EFC; the Vice-President of the EFC; the EFC Scientific Secretary; the EFC General Secretariat in the UK; the EFC General Secretariat in Germany; the EFC General Secretariat in France (a total of six copies)
- Volumes with one or more authors: three complimentary copies to each author or co-author (subject to a maximum of nine copies)
- Volumes with an editor or editors and separate chapter contributors: two copies to a single editor; one copy to each co-editor if there is more than one editor; one copy to each lead contributor of a chapter (the first-named contributor in the list of contributors to a chapter, unless otherwise agreed)

Woodhead also agrees to enable online access to the electronic version of a chapter in a new volume in the Series published by Woodhead, if requested by a lead contributor or co-contributor of that chapter.

12 Discounts

Individuals belonging to EFC Member Societies and to NACE International, together with delegates to the annual corrosion conferences organised by the EFC and NACE International, will qualify for a 30% discount from the full price charged by Woodhead on all volumes in the Series published or distributed by Woodhead.

13 Promotion of new titles in the Series

If requested by the EFC, Woodhead agrees to supply two complimentary copies of each new volume published in the Series to the EFC to display at the EFC's annual EUROCORR Conference.

14 Distribution and sale of published volumes in the Series

Providing it does not infringe any existing agreement, the EFC agrees that Woodhead may promote, sell and distribute copies of published as well as new volumes in the Series.

15 Duration of the agreement

This Agreement will take effect from date shown at the head of this Agreement. It will continue for a term of five year, after which it renew automatically for successive additional three year terms, unless either the EFC or Woodhead gives the other written notice of its intention not to renew the Agreement at least six months prior to the end of the term.

16 Assignment

This agreement may not be assigned by either party except by the prior written permission of the other party, except in the circumstances of an acquisition of more than 50% of the shareholding of Woodhead, or a change in the control of the EFC to another organisation, in which case no written permission is required.

17 Warranty

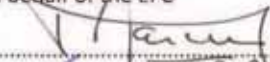

18 Legal agreement
