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UNCONFIRMED MINUTES OF THE EFC BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS

Item 01 Opening of the meeting

Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, President of the EFC and chairman of the meeting, opened the meeting and welcomed the delegates present (see attendance list).

Item 02 Apologies for Absence

Item 1 Approval of the Agenda and Adoption of the Minutes of the last Meeting

1-1 The proposed agenda was approved.

1-2 The minutes of the previous meeting in Istanbul (9 September 2012) were approved.

Item 2 Administrative Matters

2-1 Status of Applications for EFC Membership

The Frankfurt Office reported on the membership status.

The Frankfurt Office was requested to include as EFC Member Society on the Website the Serbian Society of Corrosion and Materials Protection (UISKoZaM) instead of her daughter organisation, the Engineering Society of Corrosion (ESC). As both Serbian Societies emanated from the former Yugoslavien EFC Member Societies, the Frankfurt office proposed accepting both societies as EFC Member Societies provided that UISKoZaM met the requirements for EFC membership.

The Frankfurt Office is still waiting for the statutes in English from UISKoZaM in order to proceed with the admission process.

The EFC has also received the withdrawal of two member societies:

- AITIVA (Italy);
- INETI (part of LNEG, Portugal).

2-2 Status on the Nomination of Delegates by the Member Societies in the Working Parties

The Frankfurt Office reported on the answers received from the Member Societies further to the mail sent on November 6, 2012.

Two EFC Member Societies, AIM and CEFRA COR, sent their nominations of delegates to EFC Working Parties. The nominations of Germany are currently in preparation.

A reminder will be sent requesting an answer by the end of July 2013.

The CEFRA COR raised the question of the limitation to two of the number of delegates for each Working Party because, presently, this limitation applies only at the level of the launching of a new Working Party (Cf. Directives for the establishment and operation of working parties).

This item will be clarified at the next President Advisory Committee Meeting (PACM) on the occasion of the revision of the “Directives for the establishment and operation of working parties”, the last version having been issued in 2008.

2-3 *Revision of the EFC Bye-Laws*

The project of revision of the Bye-Laws given in Appendix 1 of the Working Papers has been approved without modification.

The Frankfurt Office will propose this new version for approval by the General Assembly using an e-mail voting process.

2-4 *EFC Award for 2013*

The STAC Chairman, Dr. Damien Féron, announced that the winner of the EFC Medal 2013 is Prof. Christoffer LEYGRAF from Sweden.

He suggested attributing this award every year instead of every 2 years.

Prof. Ferreira proposed that BoA Members should be accepted as applicants. It is reminded that this limitation has been introduced in the revision of this Award Rules in 2008 as follows: “Serving members of the EFC Board of Administrators or of the Science and Technology Advisory Committee are not eligible to be awarded the European Corrosion Medal”.

These two items will be discussed during the next PACM for possible proposal(s) to the STAC for revising the “Rules for the Award of the European Corrosion Medal”.

2-5 *Proposal for the Introduction of « EFC Fellow »*

During the last PACM, the STAC Chairman, Dr. Damien Féron, proposed to study the possibility of introducing an EFC recognition for those who served EFC during several years before leaving their position (WP Chairs mainly, but also elected members of the STAC or of the BoA for instance).

During the discussions, the BoA agreed on the principle but suggested to find another wording. The idea of extending the use of the status of “Honorary Member” should be evaluated.

This action is placed on the next PACM. Dr. Damien Féron accepted to prepare a draft of rules with the assistance of the Scientific Secretary.

Item 3 Interaction with other Organisations

3-1 *EFC/NACE Collaboration*

Prof. Philippe Marcus reported on the meeting between EFC and NACE which took place on Tuesday, September 11, 2012, during EUROCORR 2012 in Istanbul, Turkey. (see Appendix 2 of the Working Papers).

He then reported on the last EFC/NACE meeting held during the Orlando NACE Conference. The EFC was represented by Willi Meier, Roman Bender and himself and NACE by six representatives.

The main topic of the meeting was the organisation of a joint workshop on CUI (Corrosion Under Insulation) “Bring On The Heat” (BOTH) in collaboration with the Working Party 15, Corrosion in the Refinery Industry, in conjunction with EUROCORR 2013 (separate event on Thursday and Friday).

The BoA approved this project which covers an interesting topic and could increase the participation of representatives from the industry to EUROCORR.

For this project, the financial risk taken will be € 15,000 for the EFC which could be covered by the reserves.

The Frankfurt Office and the EUROCORR 2013 organisers were requested to review the Agreement proposed by NACE.

In accordance with the reciprocity agreement between EFC and NACE, the BoA approved the proposal of Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, President of the EFC, for the following EFC representatives to participate to the NACE TCC meeting: EFC President, Scientific Secretary and STAC Chairman (or their deputies).

The EFC/NACE agreement signed in 2003 should be updated following the recent changes in the benefit for the NACE members.

This topic will be discussed at the next PACM.

3-2 *World Corrosion Organisation*

Prof. Philippe Marcus reported on the WCO Board of Directors meeting held during the Orlando NACE Conference. The main information is that NACE International has decided to withdraw from WCO, explaining that it is no more in line with their strategy. Another issue is a lack of major achievements 6 years after the formation of the WCO (with the exception of becoming an NGO). NACE was financially supporting WCO (\$20,000). NTI would now provide this support.

The BoA agreed that EFC continued to be a member of WCO as the other founder members, the Chinese Society for Corrosion and Protection (CSCP) and the Australasian Corrosion Association (ACA).

Prof. Philippe Marcus informed that the USA Department of Defense organized an exhibition in the Orlando Science Center. They proposed to duplicate such an event in Europe if it can be funded, (cost ~ \$ 80,000).

3-3 *ICC: Collaborations including possibility of joint Event in 2017*

Prof. Philippe Marcus reported on the meeting between ICC and EFC, which took place on Wednesday 12 September 2012 in Istanbul (see Appendix 3 of the Working Papers).

The main item concerns the possible organization of a joint ICC Conference and EUROCORR in 2017.

The dates and location of EUROCORR 2017 will be selected during the EFC BoA meeting in March 2014, before the selection of the ICC 2017 Conference to be done during the next ICC Conference (Jeju, Korea, November 2-6, 2014). Consequently, the EFC President, Prof. Lorenzo Fedrizzi, proposed to invite the ICC representatives next March 2014 to involve them at the selection of EUROCORR 2017. This item will be discussed again at the next PACM.

3-4 *EFC/ACA Collaboration*

The minutes of the meeting between ACA and EFC, which took place on Wednesday 12 September 2012 in Istanbul, were given as Appendix 4 of the Working Papers.

Prof. Philippe Marcus, EFC past-President, reported on the recent meeting between ACA and EFC held during the Orlando NACE Conference with the participation of Roman Bender for the EFC, Ian Booth (ACA CEO) and Paul Vince (ACA Past-President).

ACA confirmed their wish to strengthen their collaboration with the EFC for the following:

- To promote the participation of their members to EUROCORRs;
- To nominate delegates to EFC Working Parties;
- To provide grants to lecturers from Working Parties to visit Australia and give lectures.

Concerning this last item, the STAC Chairman mentioned that he has already asked for proposals from the Working Party Chairmen.

Item 4 EFC Activities and Projects

4-1 *Presentation of the new Scientific Secretary*

The EFC President reported on the appointment of Dr. Roman Bender as the new Scientific Secretary.

He mentioned that 6 applications have been received. Four interviews (one from France, one from Germany, one from Italy and one from UK) were organised at the Paris Office on December 19, 2012, the afternoon before the PACM.

Dr. Roman Bender has been selected. He presented himself during the meeting (see his CV in Appendix 5 of the Working Papers).

4-2 *Status on the Public Relation Position*

The EFC President reported on the status of the appointment of Mrs Juliet Ippolito as Public Relation (PR).

Further to the separation of the positions of Scientific Secretary and Public Relation, the priority was given to Mrs. Juliet Ippolito for the PR position.

She accepted this new position and will continue to collaborate with the EFC with the principle objective to recruit new Members. The agreement was signed for one year starting on March 1st, 2013.

The Scientific Secretary/PR Report prepared by Mrs. Juliet Ippolito covering the period September-October 2012 was given in Appendix 6 of the Working Papers.

4-3 EFC Publications

4-3-1 EFC Book Series

The EFC STAC Chairman, Dr. Damien Féron, reported on the progress in the preparation of the EFC Green Book Series.

Two books of the EFC series should be published at the end of 2013:

- "Corrosion and conservation of cultural heritage metals", by the WP 21 on Corrosion of Archaeological and Historical Artifacts (but some chapters are still missing);
- "Stress corrosion cracking of nickel base alloys", by WP4 on Nuclear corrosion (but some chapters have already been published in journals).

He also underlined that Woodhead are very reactive. They have contacted Maney in order to find an agreement for the sale of the existing Green Books and they are waiting for their proposal.

The progress on this action will be discussed during the next PACM.

Further to a proposal of the Australasian Corrosion Association (ACA) to distribute the Green Books in Australia, an action was placed during the last PACM on the EFC Past-President, Prof. Philippe Marcus, to contact Woodhead in order to ask them if they have a distributor in Australia.

This action is still pending and will be discussed during the next PACM.

The new publisher will be announced on the EFC website as soon as Mrs. Ines Honndorf receives the text which should be prepared by Woodhead.

On behalf of the Croatian Society for Materials Protection, Dr. Darko Rajhenbah asked the approval of the EFC to translate and publish in Croatia the Green Book n° 63 on "The corrosion performance of metals for the marine environment: a basic guide".

The request had been passed to Woodhead who answered that the EFC has the copyright in the book but Maney has the exclusive publishing rights, which do include the right to license translations. In case of EFC agreement, Woodhead suggested to be directly in contact with the Croatian Society. Maney would probably ask a formal translation agreement and required a modest sum to recognise the work that the original publisher has put into preparing the book. Maney would pay EFC a royalty on that income.

The BoA approved this proposal.

4-3-2 EFC Electronic Newsletter

An EFC e-Newsletter is scheduled to be circulated for the occasion of the WCO Corrosion Awareness Day on 24 April 2013, an initiative of the WCO.

Who does what regarding this e-Newsletter, between the Scientific Secretary and the PR was discussed during the BoA.

It is reminded that the schedule of services of the PR mentions that the preparation of EFC Press Releases, the EFC Newsletter, and the EFC e-Newsletter has to be prepared in cooperation with the Scientific Secretary.

The scientific content is the responsibility of the Scientific Secretary. Consequently, the interface with the Working Party Chairmen has to be ensured by him.

The interface with the EFC Member Societies is under the responsibility of the PR for any news to be published in the Newsletter.

4-3-3 EFC Newsletter

The hardcopy Newsletter N° 21 has to be prepared for distribution on the occasion of EUROCORR 2013.

The respective roles and responsibilities of the PR and the Scientific Secretary are the same as explained in the item 4-3-2.

4-3-4 Progress with items/articles for the Publication in the three EFC Journals

Dr. Roman Bender reported on progress regarding the publications in the Journal, “Materials and Corrosion”. A very low number of papers have been proposed for publication.

The responsibilities for the articles to be published in the “Corrosion Engineering, Science and Technology (CST) » and “Matériaux et Techniques » Journals have been discussed. The problem related to the copyright have been underlined.

Concerning the EFC scientific activities (i.e. reports on Working Parties activities), the Scientific Secretary should periodically provide to the three EFC journals the same information coming from EFC Working Parties activities collected by systematic contacts with the Working Party Chairmen.

4-3-5 Status on the other Partner Journals

The updated report of the EFC President about the Rules, Rights and Duties of the EFC official and partner Journals is provided in **Appendix 1**.
The BoA approved this report.

An action was also placed on the EFC President to contact the EFC Members Societies requesting possible candidates of EFC Partner Journals.
The result of this action is postponed for the next September Estoril BoA Meeting.

4-4 EFC Web Site, including the Progress on the use of the EFC Restricted Areas by the Member Societies

The BoA members are reminded of the login and password, which allows them direct access to the restricted area of the website:

Login: efc-boa
Password: edinburgh

Dr. Roman Bender presented the status on the latest improvements to the EFC Website.

During the previous BoA meetings in 2012, the conditions for access to the restricted areas of the Working Parties web pages were discussed.

During the Istanbul STAC Meeting, two positions were expressed:

- to restrict the access to the EFC Member Societies;
- to give access to all Working Party Members.

This topic is not addressed in the current “Bye-Laws and Directives for the establishment and operation of working parties” because the access to the Working Parties restricted areas is not mentioned.

For the time being, only two Working Parties (4 and 16) use restricted areas.

During the Istanbul Meeting last September 2012, the BoA concluded for the time being to leave the decision to each Working Party Chairman. Progress on this item will be discussed next September during the Estoril BoA Meeting after the STAC Meeting. Subject to the result of the BoA decision, the “Directives for the establishment and operation of working parties” will be revised. An action is placed on the STAC Chairman to include this item on the Agenda of the Estoril STAC Meeting in September 2013.

During the last PACM, an action was placed on the PR to check and to push EFC Member Societies to create a restricted area in their website for their members and to encourage them to implement a link from this restricted area to the EFC website restricted area. Due to the split of the position of Scientific Secretary and PR, the progress regarding this action is postponed for the next BoA Meeting.

Item 5 Finance: Honorary Treasurer’s Report

The updated report of the Honorary Treasurer including the situation of the EFC Membership Fee arrears is provided in **Appendix 2**.

Mr. Ray Milbank mentioned that there are still a number of arrears but the balance of the 2012 accounts will be in line with the budget.

BoA Members approved the Honorary Treasurer’s Report.

The Honorary Treasurer proposed to revise the Strategic Plan in order to invest part of the reserves to improve the development of the EFC. This action is placed on the next PACM.

It is reminded that the EFC President should send a letter asking unpaid Members to clarify their membership status by either paying their overdue membership fees or withdraw from EFC member.

Item 6 EUROCORR Series: 2012 to 2016

6-1 EUROCORR 2012 - Istanbul (Turkey) - Final Report

The final results of **EUROCORR 2012** in **Istanbul** were presented, see **Appendix 3**.

A questionnaire has been sent by e-mail to the attendance to obtain their comments on the event.

Prof. Fuat Çakir advised to increase the number of oral presentations (without losing quality): the minimum recommended is around 420 proposals for an objective of more than 700 delegates. For that, the following methods are suggested:

- To select a Conference Centre with enough rooms to increase the number of parallel sessions (some Working Parties may organise parallel sessions for the all duration of the Congress);
- To prepare “spare” papers until June for replacing possible missing ones.

6-2 *EUROCORR 2013 - Estoril (Portugal) - Progress with Arrangements*

EUROCORR 2013 will be held on **1 - 5 September 2013**, at the Estoril Congress Centre, near Lisbon, starting on Sunday evening and will be organized by SPM. The general theme will be **“Corrosion control for a blue sky”**.

The report presented by Prof. Fatima Montemor with arrangements for EUROCORR 2013 is given in **Appendix 4**.

The EFC official meetings STAC and BoA are scheduled on Sunday, September 1st, as usual, and the General Assembly on the following Monday, at a time to be announced later.

6-3 *EUROCORR 2014 - Pisa (Italy) - Report on Preliminary Arrangements*

EUROCORR 2014 will be held on **8 - 12 September 2014** in Pisa, Italy at the Palazzo dei Congressi. The general theme will be **“Improving Materials Durability: from Cultural Heritage to Industrial Applications”**.

Mrs. Federica Bassani reported on the preliminary arrangements for EUROCORR 2014, see **Appendix 5**.

Four additional rooms will be available at the University close to the Congress Centre.

6-4 *EUROCORR 2015 - Graz (Austria) - Initial Progress Report*

EUROCORR 2015 will be held on **6 - 10 of September 2015** in **Graz**, Austria. The general theme will be **“Earth, Fire, Water, Air, Corrosion happens everywhere”**.

Prof. Gregor Mori reported on the initial progress for EUROCORR 2015, see **Appendix 6**.

6-5 *EUROCORR 2016 - Bid(s) Presentation(s) and Selection of the Host*

Four Bids for **EUROCORR 2016** had been received by the Frankfurt Office within the deadline of 15 January 2013, see Appendix 9 to 12 of the Working papers.

Three bidders came to the meeting and presented their proposals in the following order:

- Dr. Darko Rajhenbah from Croatia;
- Prof. Philippe Marcus from France;
- Dr. Stuart Lyon from UK.

The representative of Russia, Prof. Alexander V. Muradov, sent apologies few days before the meeting due to other late commitments; consequently the Russian bid could not be presented.

The President thanked the presenters for coming and it was agreed that each would leave the room during the other's presentation. However, as member of the BoA, Prof. Philippe Marcus and Dr. Darko Rajhenbah also participated in the vote. Following the presentations, a secret ballot was carried out by the voting members of the BoA.

The winner was **France's** bid from CEFRACOR, FFC and Chimie ParisTech which is to host **EUROCORR 2016** in **Montpellier**. The proposed dates of the **11th to 15th of September 2016** were approved and the general theme will be **“Advances in Linking Science and Engineering”**.

Appendix 7 contains the French presentation.

6-6 *Progress on Exhibition Advisory Board*

BoA Members were reminded that Mr. Don Harrop has accepted to chair the “EUROCORR Exhibition Advisory Board”. The report of Mr. Don Harrop on progress of this action was given as Appendix 13 of the Working Papers.

Due to the absence of Mr. Don Harrop, an action was placed on the PACM to continue the discussions. The results will be presented at the next BoA Meeting at Estoril.

Item 7 *EFC Events and Calendar of Events*

BoA Members were reminded that the Calendar of Events is regularly updated on the EFC website by Dechema.

The board is reminded that the EFC Calendar of Events also includes non EFC-sponsored events in an attempt to draw outside interest to the EFC as a central source of information on corrosion events throughout the world.

An application form is available in the restricted area for the BoA Members to apply for an EFC Event Number.

Item 8 *Any other Business*

None.

Item 9 *Date and Place of next BoA*

The next BoA meeting will be held on 1st September 2013 afternoon, in conjunction with EUROCORR 2013, in Estoril, Portugal, at a time and place to be announced later.

PARTNER JOURNALS

The European Federation of Corrosion already possesses three official EFC journals: an English (Corrosion Engineering Science and Technology), a German (Materials and Corrosion) and a French one (Materiaux et Corrosion).

Despite the regular publication of these Journals and the presence of the EFC web-site, there is still a lack of information at the level of the members of Member Societies about EFC rules, benefits as well as activities.

In order to better spread EFC communications it is here proposed to introduce in the list of EFC Journals some more "Partner Journals", if possible located in each European Country. The new national journals proposed mustn't be some more official journals but mainly a sort of vehicle for the spreading and use of EFC communications, news, information, benefits and interests, at many different levels, not only scientific but technical and industrial, too.

These journals should usually publish documents, directly written by the EFC offices, the Scientific Secretary, the PRO or the Working Parties, which are usually available in the EFC Newsletter or in the EFC web-site, in order to better spread the EFC information.

The aims and rules of EFC, the scientific activities (conferences, workshops), the didactic courses, the benefits to become a member of an EFC Member Society, the rules of application for EFC awards, etc., all these communications need to be in a capillary way and frequently published in order to attract as much as possible of the researchers and operators worldwide involved in any of the aspects and problems of the corrosion and corrosion protection.

No special work is required by local Editors, the only aim being to make a journal page available for the publication of the EFC news, possibly in each issue. The EFC logo must be present in these pages.

The national journal does not necessarily have to be of a very high scientific standard (present in the ISI or Scopus database) but it must be of large national circulation and read by industry readers, too. A personal choice of the journal should be the translation of the news into the national language if thus favouring the spreading of the news.

The publication must be completed in due time as indicated by EFC offices especially if conference or meeting announcements are made.

If possible the national journal should be published by or should be the official journal of one Member Society. If not, the national journal should be put forward and proposed by a "number " of members of our WPs of that nationality. We should probably find someone responsible for each Member Country to target the relevant journals in their respective countries and then for checking whether the EFC pages are correctly translated and published (better if the responsible is a member of the editorial board of the national journal).

The publication of EFC news must have no direct costs for EFC. On the other hand, the possibility to publish EFC information and to use in these pages the EFC logo without any specific cost has to be considered as an advantage for the national journal and consequently no other special benefits could be involved.

On the other hand there could be found a way to advertise these journals among the EFC member societies, for example in the EFC newsletter, by creating a figure for them (EFC affiliated or partner journals). This is because, of course, we want to promote the EFC activities, but the journals also want to reach a wider audience and further potential publishers. Thus, it could be a way to motivate the editors to get more involved and maybe to have some more business dealing with the EFC texts.

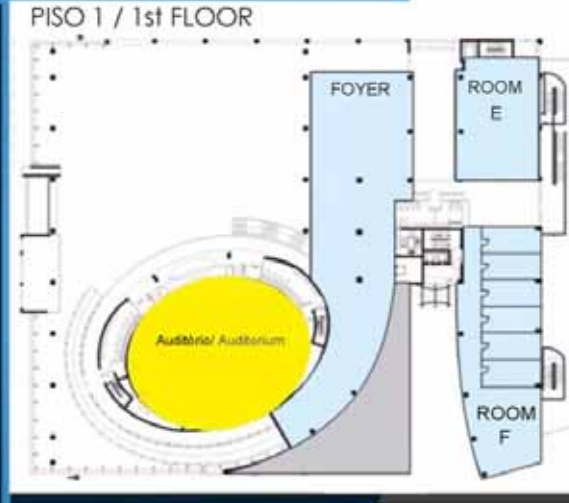

Palazzo dei Congressi
