EFC Treasurer suggested to structure the contract in a similar way to PRO's agreement for a maximum term of one year. This would make it clear that the candidate will provide services to EFC and not have an employed position with EFC as otherwise EFC might become liable for payroll and social security taxes in the candidate's country of residence;
- maximum amount of bonus;
- what is the bonus based on?

The BoA Members will be invited to adopt the final Job Description and decide the eventual appointment.

The BoA Members will be invited to identify possible candidate(s) for this position.

4-4 *Report of the new Results of the Questionnaire to EFC Member Societies*

It is reminded that, further discussions during EUROCORR 2013 in Estoril with Dr. Ing. Agnieszka KROLIKOWSKA, the BoA decided to send a questionnaire to the EFC Member Societies requesting information which would improve the cooperation among them and with the administrative bodies of the Federation.

Description of business of the company Water Technologies Laboratory Limited

Water Technologies Laboratory Limited (WTL Ltd, web site: <http://www.wtlspb.ru>) – is a Russian company (St.-Petersburg) was established in 2007.

The sphere of Company's business activity is development (along with invention and research) and sales of complex chemical reagents for water treatment, such as corrosion and scale and bio inhibitors, and chemical reagents for water purification, such as coagulants and flocculants. The Company uses different initial pure chemicals for blending and combining complex chemical reagents for different purposes in water treatment technologies. All developed reagents (chemical compounds) are product of scientific research and technological developments, as the WTL Ltd. is strongly focused on scientific research and has for it the solid scientific base.

The WTL Ltd. is the inventor and producer of own products. It is the line of highly effective and cross-functional reagents for water treatment which is used in cooling production cycle (water cooling circles (towers) and in heat supply systems. The main purpose of this type of products is to ensure the complex protection from saline deposits, corrosion and biofouling of cooling and other type of facilities with usage of water in different sectors of economy: steel and machine-building industries, electric power industry (thermal power plants, nuclear heat and power plant), oil and gas producing industry, chemical industries and municipal facilities (centralized hot water supply systems (both open and closed types)).

The other product line developed by WTL Ltd. is coagulants and flocculants, which can be used for the following purposes:

- Purification of natural water for usage in energetic sphere;
- Purification of natural water and its processing to potable water;
- Purification of waste water (industrial and municipal sector);
- Sludge or slurry decantation

The other branch of Company's activity is full range of activities and services for implementation of these technical and chemical solutions to the particular Customer's enterprise with its requirements and source data (such as water quality, its quantity etc.)

So the related service could be described as follows:

- Technical analysis of water settings in the facilities and production cycles of particular enterprise;
- Development of technical solution on the base of received data and its adjustment with Client;
- Author's overview and control during the installation process and further control of system's usage;
- Starting-up and adjustment of batch measuring equipment;
- Personnel training.

The Company is also involved into rendering of maintenance service and technical support, technical testing in the sphere of usage of the above mentioned reagents at the Customers' enterprises.

REPORT OF THE SCIENTIFIC SECRETARY TO THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS (MARCH 2015)

I participated in the very successful EUROCORR 2014 conference, 8th to 12th September in Pisa, Italy. During this conference, I took the minutes of the meeting of the STAC on 8th September with the help of Dagmar Glänzer (Frankfurt Office). Later on the same day I participated in the meeting of the EFC Board of Administrators and the EFC General Assembly on 9th September. I chaired the programme meeting of the International Scientific Committee planning the EUROCORR 2015 on 10th September.

I took part in the EFC-NACE meeting and the meeting of the **Board of Administrators** of the WCO. I took the minutes in both meetings and distributed them at the beginning of March 2015. For the rest of the week I spent some time meeting representatives of upcoming EUROCORR conferences to have a look at the workflow related to the collaboration between the local organisers and the EUROCORR Congress Secretariat at DECHEMA.

I attended the Strategic Group Meeting on 15th December in Paris; we at the Frankfurt Office took the minutes. The next day I participated in the President's Advisory Committee meeting in Paris as well.

In mid-January I composed the first draft of the scientific programme of the upcoming EUROCORR 2015, it was circulated by the DECHEMA conference office at the end of January.

I was also involved in the arrangements to host the meeting of the EUROCORR 2015 Paper Selection meeting in Vienna on 26th March, which I chaired.

In December I started organisation for the EFC booth at the NACE CORROSION 2015 Conference and Exhibition in Dallas, Texas. I contacted Jackie Hune, NACE Manager, Exhibits. EFC received a booth including furniture, according to the EFC-NACE MoU free of charge. In mid-January I started to collect promotional material advertising the upcoming EUROCORRs in Graz (2015) and Montpellier (2016). Treasurer's report to the Board of Administrators - March 2015

I am pleased to attach the following for your consideration:

1 Draft annual financial statement for the year ended 31 December 2014 (Annex 1, pages 1 to 3)

Draft results for the year ended 31 December 2014 are shown on page 1. The surplus for the year is expected to be in a region of €43,600. This figure is subject to change as EFC is yet to receive a number of expenditure invoices and confirmation of the final EuroCorr 2014 levy income.

Total income is therefore expected to exceed budgeted by €18,000 and that of 2013 by €12,000 due to the increase in subscription income and membership fee arrears collected during the year. Final EuroCorr 2014 levy amount is yet to be confirmed but is expected to be in a region of €23,000.

Costs are estimated to be €4,000 higher than in 2013 but €18,000 lower than budget. A number of invoices are yet to be received and therefore large proportion of costs has been estimated based on the budget and prior year expenditure.

As a result of the surplus, year-end reserves are expected to be in excess of €242,000. Having achieved its corporate aims for finance, EFC is now in a good position to develop and promote its objectives. However, while a new 5 year strategic plan is being developed, €200,000 will be transferred to a deposit account in order to generate some interest income and preserve funds for future development.

2 Budget for 2015 and 2016 (Annex 2)

The annex shows the results for 2014 and the budget for 2015 and 2016. 2015 budget has been adjusted to take into account recent changes to the support structure and shows an operating surplus of €22,600, whilst 2016 budget shows an operating surplus of €4,850.

Income has been included at a level achieved in 2014 and expenditure allows for:

- Continued development of the website and some support for working parties,
- Contract for the part-time managing officer, incorporating PR and administrative support roles, and
- Provision for €10,000 to fund strategic actions.

3 Subscriptions (Annex 3 and 4)

Annex 3 summarises subscriptions due in 2014 and Annex 4 summarises subscriptions due in 2015. 2015 subscriptions have already been invoiced and we have received €31,030 by 18 February 2015. Subscriptions outstanding for 2015 amount to €29,145 and earlier years - €8,655.

Please note that payments received after 18 February 2015 are not included in the subscriptions report. Members are requested to pay outstanding subscriptions prior to the General Assembly meeting in September.

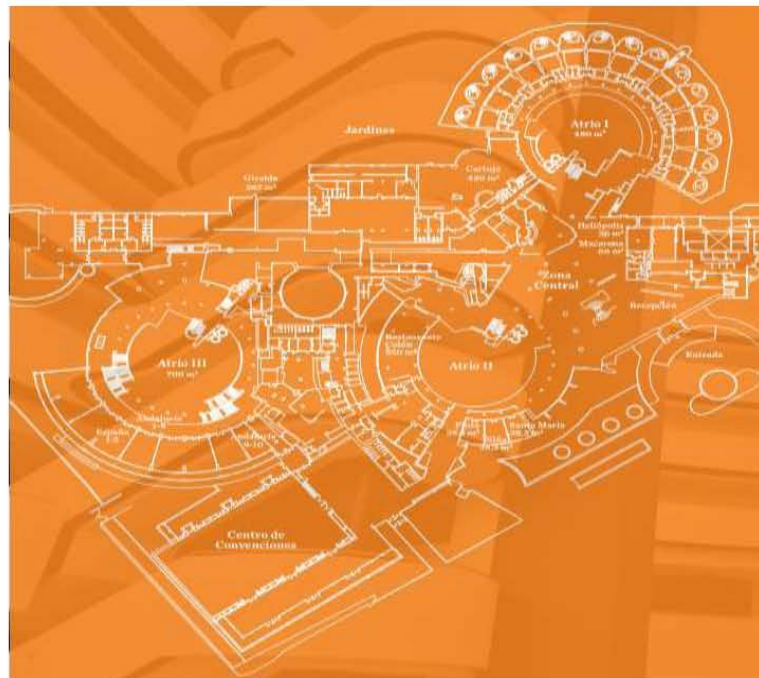
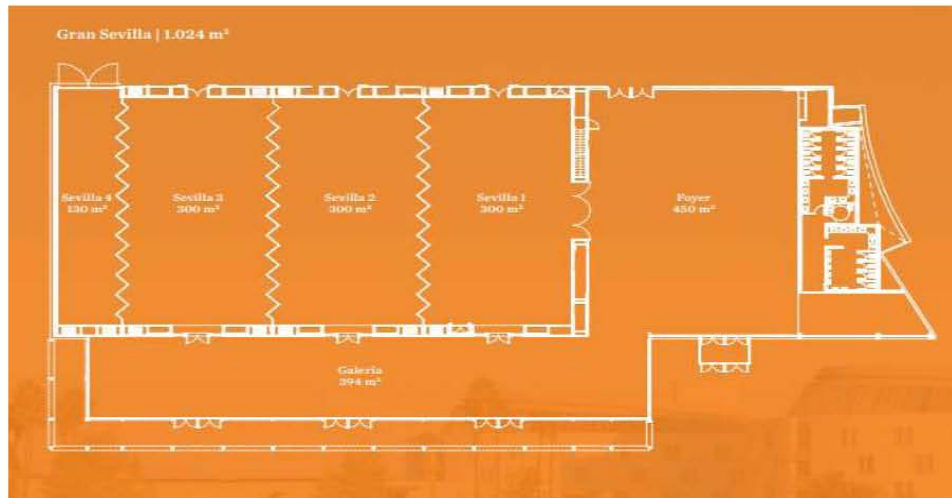
