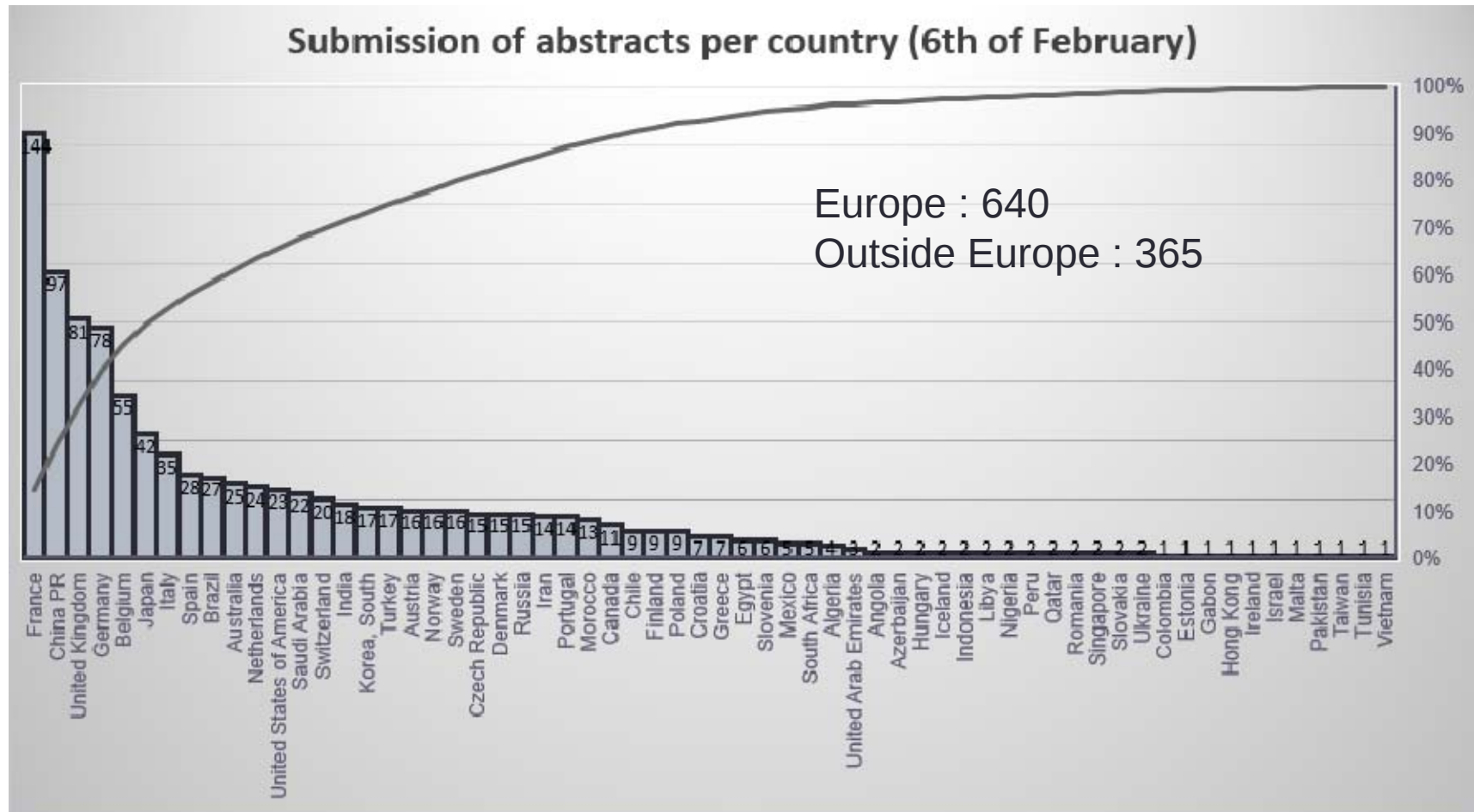
EUROCORR Arrangements

12th of March 2020

- 1022 submitted abstracts (877 oral presentations)
- Deadline for oral presentation submission: 29th of January 2020
- Deadline for the poster submission: 25th of March - no abstract submitted since the 12th of March
- Based on the oral submissions (29th of January deadline), a program with 15th parallel sessions was scheduled

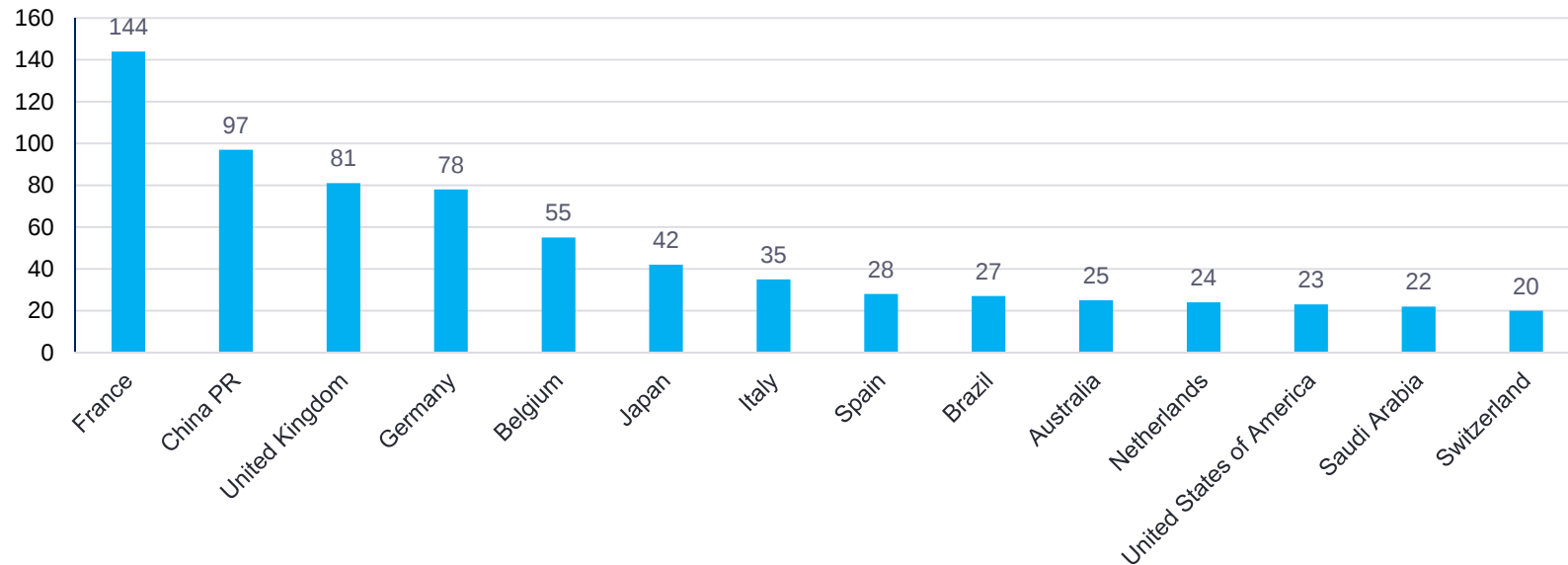

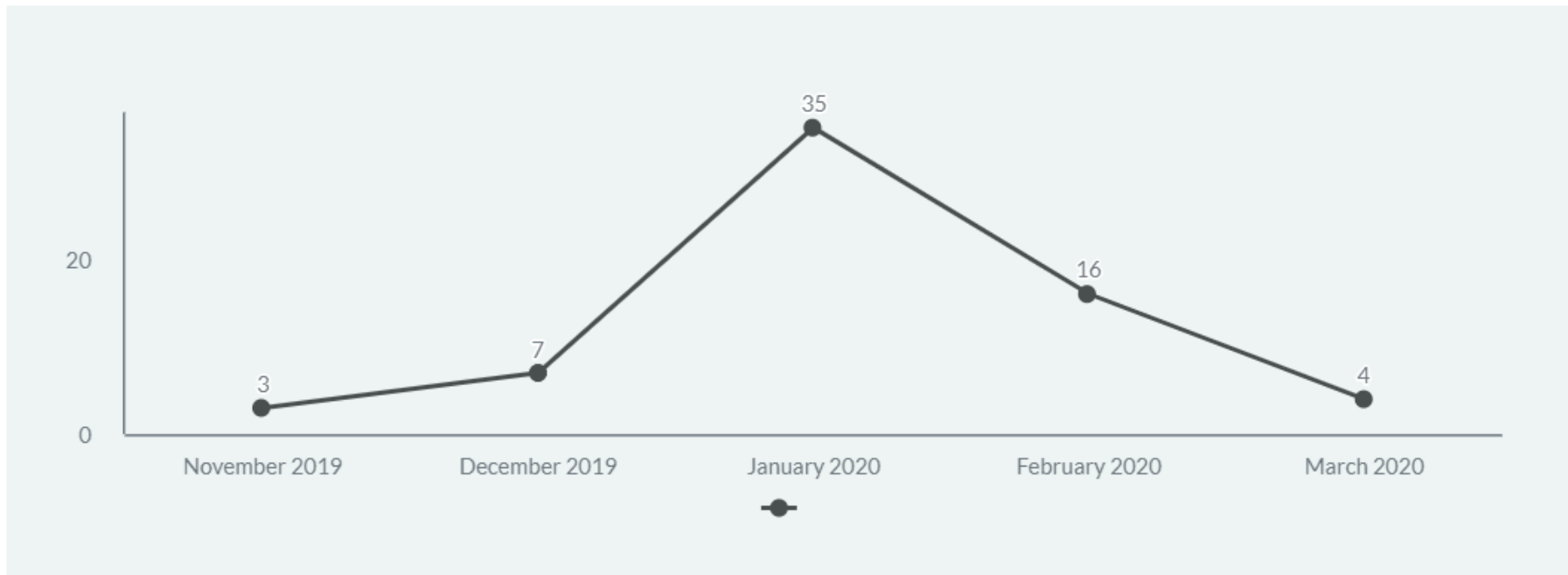
Countries with more than 20 submitted abstracts

12th of March 2020

- Exhibitors and sponsors : 27 exhibitors, 3 bronze sponsors and 1 silver sponsor
- More than 7 potential exhibitors have shown their interest between the 1st of and the 10th of March but they didn't confirm yet.
- Based on the loyalty programme, no invoice before the 1st of May in order to respect the priority rules and the reduced fee for the new affiliated members.
- Most sponsors and exhibitors will cancel their participation due to the corona crisis and budget restrictions.

EUROCORR Arrangements

12th of March 2020

- E-poster application is finalized (for mobile & PC devices). A test was organized on the 17th of January at VUB with all the expected e-chair persons and PCO
- Rules for the oral presentation prizes have been defined (Y-parts)
- The arrangements for the social events were taken (Gala dinner, poster and exhibition reception)
- Three newsletters have been sent

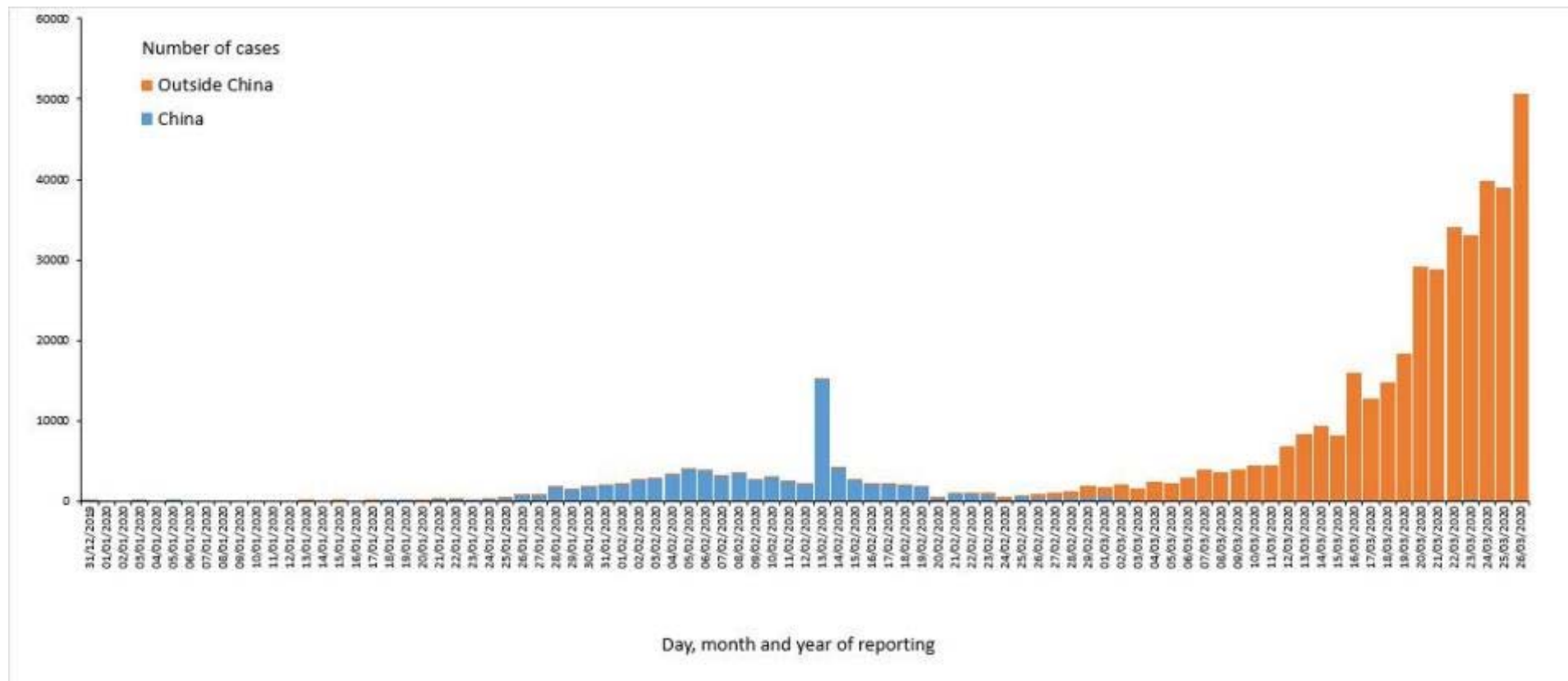
EUROCORR Arrangements

- Some speakers were invited for different specific sessions (coatings, automotive, aerospace, cathodic protection, mbees, ...)

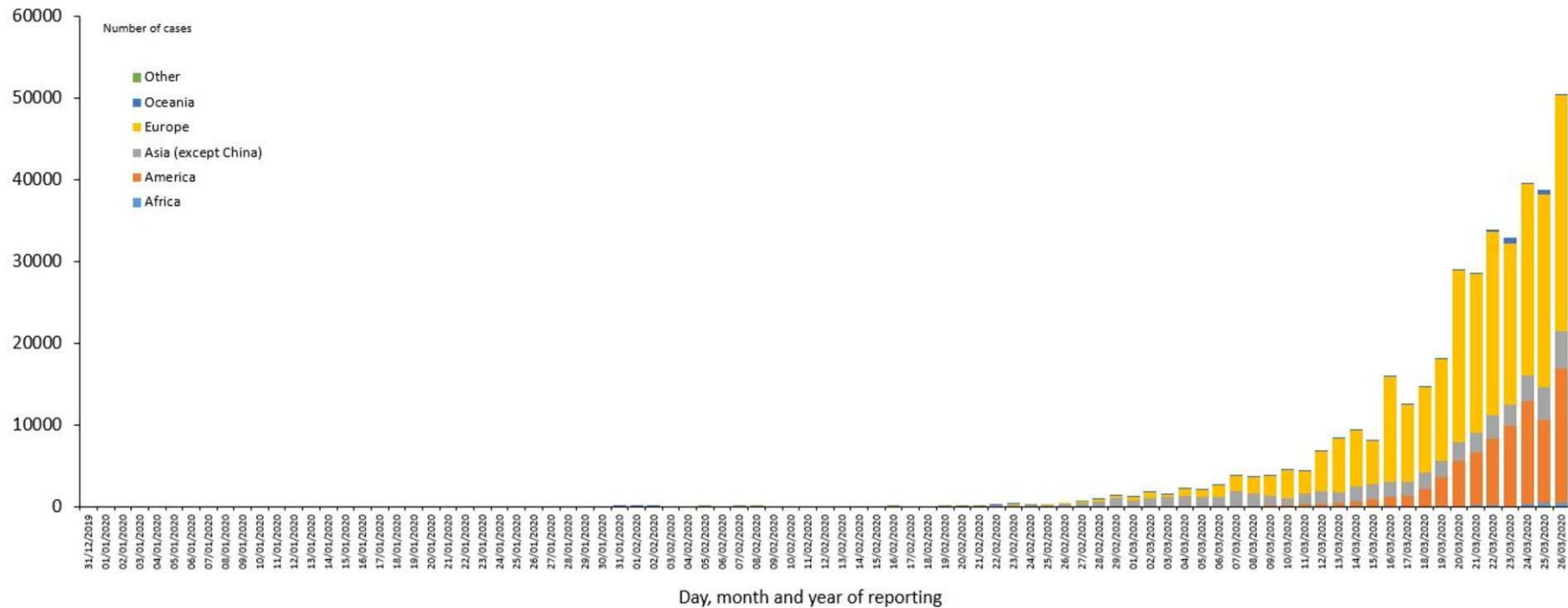

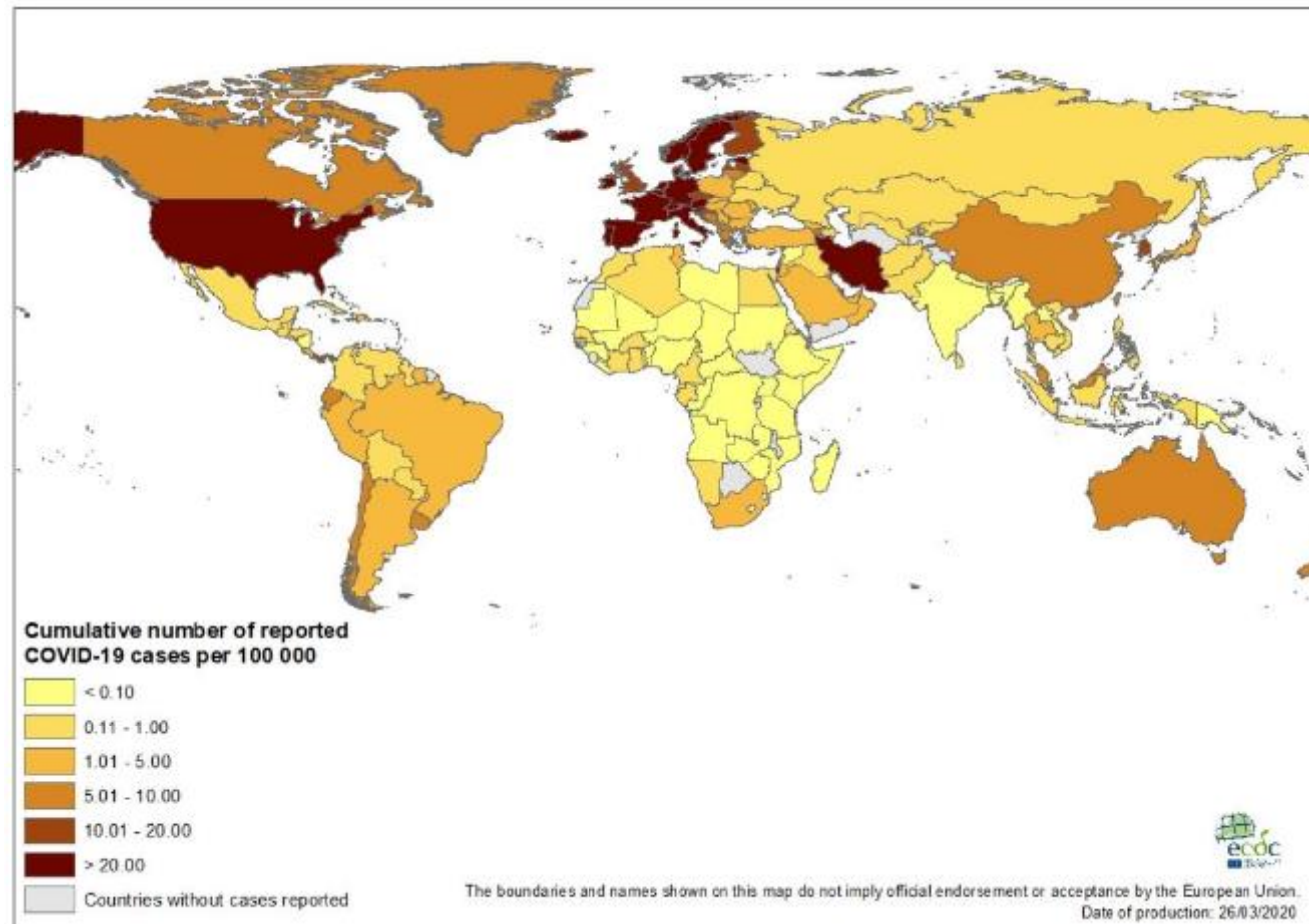

Coronavirus situation

Consequences

- ❑ Lock down in more than 35 countries
- ❑ Closure of the frontiers
- ❑ Closure of universities (till the end of June in Belgium)
- ❑ Economic crisis
- ❑ Cancellation of Olympic Games
- ❑ Worldwide sanitary evolution (The end of the first wave will depend on the country and the location - risk of the second wave)
- ❑ The heart of Europe will be unpopular till the end of 2020.

Coronavirus

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- Budget presented at the bid: a minimum of 750 paying participants with maximum 10 parallel sessions is required to be break even.
- How many people will be authorized by their institution or by their government to attend the congress: Italian, Spanish, Brazilian, Australian, Chinese people???
- How many participants will register before the end of June???
- What about the travel restrictions and air traffic?
- The program needs to be finalized before the end of June and all the arrangements needs confirmation

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR is maintained at the same place and the same location (6-10 September 2020)**
- ❑ We need to respect the Governmental restrictions related to the organization of large events (<https://www.vrt.be/vrtnws/nl/2020/03/25/viroloog-marc-van-ranst-kunnen-pas-voorspelling-doen-over-teru/>)
- ❑ The program needs to be adapted because of several plenary and invited speakers cancelled already.
- ❑ A mail must be sent by EUROCORR secretariat to all the presenters to know if they are willing and/or authorized to attend the congress (meaning a registration before the end of June) – reply required for the 20th of April

Coronavirus – Scenario 1

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR is maintained at the same place and the same location (6-10 September 2020)**
- ❑ If the number of maintained contributions is lower than 500, the congress must be postponed or cancelled
- ❑ If the number is higher than 500, the program must be revised considering the updated submission program
- ❑ Max: 10 parallel sessions and perhaps an adaptation of the catering
- ❑ Probably no sponsors and no exhibitors
- ❑ Obligation to reduce costs relating to low participation and less support by companies – basic catering, social events which are included in the price of the registration fee cancelled, basic technical equipment etc.
- ❑ The LOC will not allow a financial disaster.

Coronavirus – Scenario 2

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR Webinar (6-10 September 2020)**
- ❑ Totally new concept, new approach of the participants
- ❑ Lack of time for development and testing
- ❑ All technical problems needs to be tackled before the congress in collaboration with all speakers and chairs.
- ❑ Purchase of licences for the programme for online meetings – software payment
- ❑ Additional costs relating to development of the new system
- ❑ The EUROCORR congress is a major event. The success is also determined by personal conversations and contacts.
- ❑ What will be the business model to earn income??

Coronavirus – Scenario 3

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR is postponed for several months (before the end 2020)**
- ❑ To check the Governmental restrictions related to the organization of large events before the end of the year
- ❑ This event will be in competition with other postponed events already planned (SMT34 in Poitiers in October, Prime 2020 in Hawaiï in October, ICC in December, NACE/CORROSION).
- ❑ November and December are not attractive in Europe and many academia have many lessons. The economy will be the priority for many industries.
- ❑ Probably no sponsors and exhibitors
- ❑ Difficult to have an idea about the coronavirus progression. What will be the sanitary situation worldwide?
- ❑ No certainties!
- ❑ Limited availability of SQUARE

Coronavirus – Scenario 3

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR is postponed for several months (before the end of 2020). If this solution is selected:**
- ❑ The previous abstract submission could be (re)used
- ❑ A mail needs to be sent by EUROCORR secretariat to all the presenters to know if they are still willing and/or authorized to attend the congress (meaning a registration before the end of September) – reply required for the 10th of May.
- ❑ If the number of maintained contributions is lower than 500, the congress must be postponed or cancelled
- ❑ If the number is higher than 500, the program must be revised considering the updated submission program
- ❑ Max: 10 parallel sessions and perhaps an adaptation of the catering
- ❑ Possibility of maintaining arranged obligations

Coronavirus – Scenario 4

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR Brussels is postponed to 2021**
- ❑ Issue : EUROCORR is an annual event
- ❑ Arrangements/contracts for Budapest and Berlin are already signed with LOC/EFC/PCO/Convention Centre
- ❑ The abstract submission should be redone anyway (starting point)
- ❑ Some arrangements could be postponed and reused with suppliers
- ❑ No availability at SQUARE - the second half of the year 2021 is no longer available

Coronavirus – Scenario 5

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR Brussels is postponed to 2023**
- ❑ Due to the circumstances, Brussels could be selected by the BOA for the 2023 edition
- ❑ The partners, the location and the PCO will be the same
- ❑ The abstract submission will be redone
- ❑ Some arrangements could be postponed and reused
- ❑ The complementary team has acquired experience and proved the attractiveness of its 2020 proposal (high number of sponsors/exhibitors/submitted abstracts before the coronavirus)

Coronavirus – Scenario 5

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

- ❑ **EUROCORR Brussels is postponed to 2023**
- ❑ Availability of SQUARE
- ❑ Possibility of maintaining arranged obligations. Negotiations with suppliers about the cancellation conditions.
- ❑ Organization platform retained – use of registration forms, obligations agreed with suppliers

Coronavirus – Scenario 6

EUROCORR 2020 consequences

EUROCORR 2020 in Brussels will be cancelled

- ❑ Big economic loss for the Belgian team because nothing could be reused
- ❑ Suppliers will apply cancellation conditions
- ❑ Final decision should be taken between the middle and the end of April 2020
- ❑ Rescheduling the event is the safest solution and allows the LOC and PCO to minimise the financial loss.

EFC Strategic Plan

2019-2023

Version approved by the PAC during its meeting on 17 December 2019

Purpose

The purpose of the strategic plan is to strengthen the position of EFC as the leading European society and among the leading corrosion societies worldwide on corrosion and corrosion protection in a competitive world.

The main objectives are to strengthen membership relations, to improve international cooperation, to increase EFC visibility worldwide, to ensure a sustainable *modus operandi* of EFC and consolidate EUROCORR as THE global scientific event in corrosion-related topics.

Strategic goals

1. To strengthen the EFC position as the leading federation in Europe in close dialogue and collaboration with its member societies based on sound, efficient and sustainable internal organisation of EFC.
2. To disseminate the highest level of scientific knowledge by organising globally - recognised events.
3. Enhanced global visibility of EFC by consolidating strategic partnerships in various regions of the world.
4. Increase the number of members with special focus on affiliate memberships also from European countries without member societies.
5. Influence European research agendas with suitable lobbying measures.
6. Establish a European scheme for training and qualification of personnel.
7. Knowledge exchange platform for industry in Europe
8. Gain young researchers for EFC – staff functions, BoA and YEFC
9. Contemporary appearance of EFC in digital media

Details

1. Strengthen the EFC position

1. Ensure a sound, efficient and sustainable internal organisation of EFC (P, 2020-21)
Open for next BoA meeting (PAC / BoA meeting July)
2. Establish a series of industry-focused events (50 to 100 people) in cooperation with member societies (MO / first event in 2021) (wait for business plan PAC/BoA July)
 - Define the financial scheme of these events. Can EFC give financial support, i.e. for covering expenses of a few students? If Member Societies pay a levy, at what level? To be discussed during the BoA meeting on 31 March 2020.
 - Check with STAC if particular themes / events type are advisable, and get general STAC feedback (e.g. on WP involvement). Deadline 30 April 2020
 - Contact Member Societies and Affiliate Members to market the proposal. Message in May and direct information during GA meeting in September 2020.
 - From the collected answers, define a list of the first events to be organised in 2021. If necessary, define the organisation needed from EFC side. Deadline 31 September 2020.
3. Develop a robust business plan identifying new revenue streams to support the growth of the EFC (MO)
 - Identify new revenue streams, to be presented to the PAC meeting in Summer 2020.
 - Ask Julija support to prepare a business plan, to be presented to the BoA meeting in September 2020

2. To disseminate knowledge (WP Chairs / STAC / MO)

1. Publish videos of special lectures from EUROCORR (Publish the first minute on youtube.com. "If you want to learn more: visit www.efcweb.org") (MO)
 - Identify the special lectures to be filmed, in collaboration with the STAC. Deadline: 30 April 2020
 - Solve the practical details of video capturing during EUROCORR (equipment, who will film, GDPR compliance), in collaboration with local organisers. Deadline: 30 June 2020
 - In parallel: solve the practical details of video treatment after EUROCORR (software, format, how to have it on EFC website). Deadline 30 June 2020
 - After EUROCORR, put videos on Youtube and on EFC website. Deadline 30 October 2020.
 - Include instructions in EUROCORR Manual in order to ensure continuity of actions in future. Deadline 31 December 2020.

2. Training Webinars for special measurement techniques or experimental methods (WP 8)
 - Discuss in next WP 8 meeting and form a task group from the WP (September 2020)
 - Create a list of possible webinars (September 2020)
 - Produce webinars from WP 8 (continuously)
3. Publication of white papers (WPs)
 - Encourage WP chairs to publish EFC White Papers on specific topics (STAC chairman till 30 April 2020)
 - Collect suggestions from WPs (STAC chairman till 31 August 2020)
 - Further discussion in STAC meeting (September 2020)
 - Write papers in WPs (continuously)
4. Publication of new EFC "green" books. Revision of old volumes and creation of new books with unpublished content. (SS)

This is a continuous process that should result in one green book per year. This can only be achieved with the help of STAC members. During each STAC meeting, the latest status of the current book projects is requested and the WP Chairs are asked to think about a new project or to update the content of an existing book. SS to contact Elsevier (Arjan to inform SS)

3. Enhanced global visibility

1. Organising joint events with e.g. WCO, NACE, ACA, CSCP and others (President to coordinate)

The EFC can offer seminars together with member associations. These could for example be developed especially for Chinese clients to disseminate knowledge that is already existing in Europe. The seminars should first be offered in Europe. MO

- Select one or max. 2 organisations to initiate collaboration with, e.g. WCO and CSCP, in collaboration with STAC (possibly WP7 if courses are considered e.g. in China?). Deadline 31 March 2021.
- Contact the organisation(s) selected, define the first joint event: theme, date, financial scheme, organisation, in collaboration with STAC. Deadline September 2021.

2. Booth during events of partner organisations such as NACE CORROSION (SS)

During the BoA meeting in Seville I presented a plan for the implementation of this project including the associated costs. It was decided that an exhibition stand should only be equipped at the EUCOCORR and NACE conferences, since the costs are too high. It was

also decided that the visibility of the EFC should be increased by promotional material at events that have requested an EFC event No.

3. Find more partner journals that publish EFC news. To do this, contact the member societies (especially the non-European ones.) SS

Can either be implemented immediately, in this case I would write to all EFC members before the BoA meeting and encourage the EFC members, that the respective official journal of the national society becomes a partner journal of the EFC. Or we wait for the official decision of the BoA at the end of March. The call should be repeated at regular intervals (e.g annually) unless there is a clear rejection as a reply. Contact SS with GA - visitors

4. Increase the number of members

1. Regain lost members and acquire new members with convincing membership packages (MO)

- Following the current marketing of the special offer Affiliate Membership & Booth: evaluate success, explore possibilities of improvement of the Affiliate Membership or of the package Membership & Booth. Deadline 31 March 2020 (report to BoA).

5. Influence European research agendas with lobbying measures, (P with help from Belgian office)

1. Invite European Research Commissioner to conferences MO

- (I can take the lead if Roman agrees) Check with RB what are pertinent activities that can be proposed to the commissioner (meeting with WP7?) and write to the commissioner (Mariya Gabriel, cab-gabriel-contact@ec.europa.eu) MO to coordinate with Marjorie Olivier and local organizers

- Here it is to clarify whether the participation fee will be cancelled and what role the commissioner should play (short speech during the opening?) SS

2. Invite EU Commission to EUROCORR in Brussels (Marie Olivier begin 2020)

Pending, Marjorie already is on a good way

3. Make appointments with EU officials in Brussels BoA

Which commissioner are to be addressed (lead MO) how to influence the research agenda ?

4. Use of white paper (people put in charge for lobbying measures)

White papers will be elaborated in WPs chaired by STAC; sharing tasks and fixing deadlines during next STAC meeting

6. Training and qualification schemes (STAC)

1. Establish a scheme for EFC approved courses, EFC Corrosion passport

- Ask WP chairs for collection of existing courses in Europe (WP 7/TF chair till 15 April 2020)
 - Collect list of existing courses (WP 7/TF chair till 31 August 2020)
 - Further development of concept in WP 7/TF (31 August 2020)
 - Presentation of status in STAC meeting and agreement upon steps forward (September 2020)
 - Introduce EFC label for courses (2021)
2. Create a benefit for the member associations in which we only accept events of the EFC members (With EFC Event No.) for the Corrosion passport (EFC Frankfurt office / SS) WCO and EFC together as a certificate of advanced training
 3. WP 7 delivers content, MO organize process, STAC to ensure quality level
 - To be defined with WP7
 - To be discussed in STAC meeting (September 2020)
 4. Influence relevant standardising actions and harmonise qualification across Europe, WP
 - To be defined with WP 7/TF
 - To be discussed in STAC meeting

7. Knowledge exchange platform for industry (MO,

1. Session at EUROCORR for application oriented industrial presentations
 - Contact local organisers and ask them about the possibility to organise these sessions during EUROCORR 2020, in collaboration with STAC if necessary. Check what support they may need from EFC side. Deadline 31 December 2020

 - Include requirements / instructions in EUROCORR Manual in order to ensure continuity of actions in future. Deadline 31 December 2020.

- Virtual show room in addition to exhibition, possibility to be offered for interested organisations from outside Europe (ideas to be developed by SS and MO together with the local organizers)

8. Gain young researchers for EFC-staff (YEFC)

1. Succession planning in WP Chairs and Co-chairs (responsible WP Chairs controlled by STAC)
2. Seek suitable candidates for major EFC functions (VP) goal: 1 person per year
3. Modify byelaws: limited number of service years for WP Chairs and Co-Chairs. Co-Chairs must be younger than Chair (Responsible SS)

BELGIUM LAW CHANGES

BOA – 31 March 2020

OVERVIEW

- ❑ New law governing how associations operate came into effect on 1 January 2020
- ❑ Some changes to EFC Statutes are needed
- ❑ Some changes to EFC operations are needed

STATUTES



- ❑ New Companies and Associations Code effective 1 January 2020
- ❑ Changes to Statutes must be submitted by 31 December 2023
 - ▣ Small changes to terminology used in Statutes
 - ▣ Specify persons entrusted with daily management of Association
 - ▣ Good opportunity to make other changes to Statutes

APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTS

- ❑ Annual accounts now must be approved by GA no later than 6 months after the year-end
- ❑ Current situation:
 - ▣ Year-end 31 December
 - ▣ GA in September
 - ▣ Non-compliant
- ❑ Proposal:
 - ▣ Change year-end to 31 March
 - ▣ Keep GA in September
 - ▣ Current financial year 1 Jan 2020 – 31 Mar 2021

TAX ON ASSETS



- Possibly need to comply with Belgium 'wealth' tax of 0.17% on assets over €25,000
- For EFC this is approx. €500
- Tax authority normally issues declaration in February (not received yet)
- Seeking clarification from lawyers and tax accountant
- Need to open savings account to separate operating funds from non-essential funds

EFC-NACE TASK FORCE

Gareth Hinds – 31st Mar 2020

Update

- ❑ NACE still in advanced talks with SSPC over merger, which looks increasingly likely
- ❑ Global coronavirus outbreak will hit NACE hard, with cancellation of annual conference and many training courses around the world
- ❑ EFC-NACE meeting scheduled for March 18 postponed until June 17 (during rescheduled NACE conference)

Strategy

- Changes to MoU with NACE drafted by Roman Bender following constructive meeting in Sevilla in Sept 2019
 - EFC will provide 2 complementary EuroCorr registrations to NACE (matching NACE offer)
 - Both EFC and NACE agree not to organise conferences on each other's territory, other than those with a specific corrosion theme
 - Both organisations agree to contact the other directly rather than through individual societies or local organising committees

Strategy

- ❑ Draft MoU sent to NACE ahead of Corrosion 2019 conference
- ❑ Proposed to sign it at meeting on March 18
- ❑ Postponement of conference means MoU should now be signed in June
- ❑ NACE are actively ramping up their training course offering in Europe – this may be the next item to address

Collaboration

- ❑ Young people
- ❑ ISO standards
- ❑ Influencing organisations such as IMO
- ❑ Joint oil and gas symposia at EuroCorr/NACE conferences
- ❑ Common themes such as materials sustainability
- ❑ Response to coronavirus?



ACTIVITIES IN CHINA

ICCPA 2019

- ❑ **I**nternational **C**onference on **C**orrosion **P**rotection and **A**pplication
- ❑ Chongqing, October 9–12, 2019
- ❑ Organized by Chongqing Wujiu Periodicals Press
- ❑ 400 participants, 91 presentations, 18 invited lectures delivered by EFC experts
- ❑ Levy to EFC (10 %): ¥ 62,650
- ❑ Generally successful event

Future ICCPA

- Chinese partners wish to organize ICCPA regularly
- Proposed as a biennial event; next ICCPA in May 2021
- CSCP represented by professor Dawei Zhang support it; included in the organization team
- Similar conditions: Industry focused, ≈ 20 European experts free of charge, 10% levy
