WORKING PAPERS OF THE EFC BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS (BoA)

Item 1 Opening of the meeting

Prof. Arjan Mol, President of the EFC and Chairman of the meeting, will welcome the delegates.

Item 2 Apologies for Absence

Mrs. Pascale Bridou Buffet, Paris Office, will announce apologies received for absence.

Item 3 Approval of the Agenda and Adoption of the Minutes of the last Meeting

3-1 BoA members will be asked to approve the proposed agenda.

3-2 BoA members will be asked to approve the minutes of Webinar Meeting that took place on 25 June 2020 and to raise any issues not covered in the present agenda.

Item 4 Report on STAC Activities

4-1 Summary of the STAC Meeting

Prof. Wolfram Fürbeth, Chairman of STAC, will summarize the main progress, initiatives and activities of the STAC.

4-2 Proposal of EFC Grant from Dr. Hosseinpour (HI)

During the President Advisory Committee Meeting (PACM) that took place on 24 June 2020, a representative of the Young EFC, Dr. Cem Örnek, presented the project of “flight 752 memorial grant” proposed by Dr. Hosseinpour from Iran, see **Appendix 1**. This grant project stems from the will of Dr. Hosseinpour to honour the victims of the tragic airplane crash on 8th January 2020 in Iran, and to give the possibility to young Iranian corrosionists to travel to Europe.

Dr. Cem Örnek underlined that the proposal is very open, and that the support expected from EFC is mainly the possibility to use the EFC infrastructure (e.g. announcement of the grant on the EFC website). A waiver on the registration fee of the winner would also be appreciated.

Although the continuation of the grant cannot be guaranteed in the long run, Dr. Cem Örnek informed that Dr. Hosseinpour has already collected about €2,000, which is enough for the grant to be awarded during approximately 4 years.

The PAC members were generally very supportive of the proposal, which is fully aligned with the overall objectives of the EFC to support the community of young corrosionists. Prof. Damien Féron, currently President of the WCO, proposed to consider to involve the WCO in this initiative.

The PAC members did the following remarks:

- This new grant should be coherent with the already existing EFC grants.
- The name of the grant should preferably be changed so that it does not directly refer to an event which is politically-related and loaded with sad feelings; an alternative could be to name the grant after a prominent corrosionist that was present in the plane, if any (ideally a lady in order to promote gender equality).

- The grant could also refer to an Iranian session organized during the EUROCORN of the year when the grant will be first awarded.
- The procedure and the rules of the grant, including especially the selection of the winner, should be defined.

The PAC members agreed to initiate a Task Force (TF) "Grants and Awards", composed of Dr. Hélène Illaire (lead), Dr. Cem Örnek, Prof. Damien Féron and one STAC representative to be proposed by Prof. Wolfram Fürbeth.

An action was placed on this TF "Grants and Awards" to prepare a proposal of the rules and the details of the grant, to be presented to STAC for approval and for information to the BoA in September 2020.

Dr. Hélène Illaire will report on progress made by this TF.

4-3 Nomination by the BoA of the BoA Jury Members for the Honorary Fellow Award

BoA Members will be invited to nominate the BoA Jury Members for the Honorary Fellow Award.

Item 5 Administrative Matters

5-1 Voting Rights BoA Members: Homogenisation Statutes and Bye-Laws (AM)

It has been pointed out that there is a difference between the EFC Statutes and Bye-Laws regarding the list of BoA Members with voting rights as follows:

Statutes

The BoA shall consist of a President and Vice-President as the most powerful executives of the Association, the Immediate Past President and twelve administrators **all with full voting rights**, supported by the ex officio offices of Treasurer and Scientific Secretary who have no voting rights.

Bye-Laws

11.1.1 **One member representing each of the General Secretariat offices (France, Germany and UK) and one from the country of registration in law (Belgium) of the EFC, together with eight other elected members**, three representing Member Societies drawn from amongst European Members in countries other than the four administrators referred to above and five drawn from amongst the EFC members at large, i.e. European and International Members. **Only these twelve members are entitled to vote.**

The EFC President will propose to update the Bye-Laws with the Statutes which is the current practice.

5-2 EFC Overall Strategy (JV)

During the webinar BoA that took place on 25 June 2020, the Honorary Treasurer, Ms. Julija Bugajeva, presented provisional budgets for 2021 to 2024. She explained that due to the current situation, it is extremely difficult to predict the EFC budget for the coming years because they depend on various factors mostly related to Covid-19 restrictions which are even difficult to foresee for the coming months. Indeed, we do not know actually when the travel restrictions will be lifted and what would be the consequences on the organisation of EUROCORN 2021.

It was agreed that before preparing further options for the business plan, the strategy of the future overall organisation of the EFC (organisation of the General Secretariat and of EUROCORR) should be defined.

The EFC vice-president Dr. Jörg Vogelsang, who agreed to take the lead of this discussion, will present proposals for the future organisation of the EFC.

5-3 EFC Digital Strategy (WM)

During the webinar BoA that took place on 25 June 2020, the EFC President, Prof. Arjan Mol expressed the need of an invoice or official letter from DECHEMA of the Digital Strategy budget announced for €20,000 during the PACM that took place in Frankfurt on 17 December 2019, for presentation to the General Assembly (GA), the minutes of this meeting being the official archives of the EFC.

Prof. Willi Meier is kindly invited to provide this document for recommendation to the GA.

Prof. Willi Meier will also report on progress regarding the implementation of the EFC Digital Strategy.

5-4 Applications for EFC Membership (FO)

The Frankfurt Office will report on any new application(s) to join the EFC and resignation(s), if any.

5-5 Affiliate Membership Program (HI)

During the virtual BoA meeting that took place on 25 June 2020, the Managing Officer, Dr. Hélène Illaire, reported that one or two years ago, only 6 Affiliate Members were member of the EFC. With the implementation of the Affiliate Membership Program, there are now 14 Affiliate Members. The BoA agreed that this is a good program which must be continued.

An action was placed to the Frankfurt Office to promote this program for the virtual edition of EUROCORR 2020.

The Managing Officer, Dr. Hélène Illaire, will report on progress regarding the visibility and marketing of the Affiliate Membership programme.

5-6 Administrative Procedures and Legal Obligations in Belgium (HI, MO)

A Royal Decree of 30 July 2018 on the operating procedures of the UBO Register entered into force in Belgium on 31 October 2018 following a European Directive whose main aim is to combat money laundering and the financing of terrorism. Each Member State must now establish a register which will centralize adequate, accurate and current information on the beneficial owners of incorporated companies in Belgium, trusts, foundations and (international) non-profit associations, and legal entities similar to trusts. It is maintained by the SPF Finance, General Treasury Administration. The deadline for providing the information to the UBO register was first set by Belgian authorities to 31st of March 2019 but was postponed to 30 September 2019.

It has to be noted that the UBO is a new law in Belgium which force all societies to establish this register.

With the renewal of the Board of Administrators at the beginning of 2020, it is mandatory to publish the new composition in the Belgian Gazette. This publication is supported by a Jurist in

Brussels who expressed the need of a declaration upon Honour of each BoA Member in addition to the previous documents already provided.

During the publication procedure in the Moniteur Belge, the jurist needs also to update the official database “Crossroad Bank for Enterprises” with the new administrators.

In accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the management of the private data must be very secure, for example encrypted.

Dr. Hélène Illaire will report on action undertaken to follow up on this issue to make EFC procedures, correspondence and archives GDPR-compliant in the near future.

5-6 EFC Visibility (RB)

During the BoA Meeting that took place on 1st and 2nd April in Seville, Dr. Roman Bender reported that many European people visit the EFC Booth each year at NACE Conference, and most do not know about EUROCORR.

The Past-President, Prof. Damien Féron suggested to make the promotion of the EFC on the occasion of other events like the EFCE Congress, EUROMAT, etc., proposing them to present their event during the EUROCORR.

It has to be noted that EUROCORR and EUROMAT follow each other and sometimes an overlapping of the dates exists.

It has also been proposed to advertise EFC during the ACHEMA, for example with a common booth with GfKORR.

An action was placed on Dr. Roman Bender to prepare a plan and budget on how to give more publicity for EUROCORR.

Dr. Roman Bender will present proposals to the BoA Members.

Item 6 Financial Issues (JB)

6-1 Current Subscriptions Overview

The Honorary Treasurer, Ms. Julija Bugajeva, will present the status of subscriptions paid by EFC Member Societies (year-to-date).

6-2 Updated Budget for 2020

During the webinar BoA that took place on 25 June 2020, the EFC Honorary Treasurer, Ms. Julija Bugajeva, explained that the main changes in the Budget for 2020 would be the EUROCORR Levy and the EFC Digital System.

It was agreed that the 2020 budget will be updated in line with the explanations above and distributed to the BoA Members for an e-mail voting process along with the pending proposed mutual agreement between EFC and DECHEMA for the virtual EUROCORR 2020.

The Honorary Treasurer, Ms. Julija Bugajeva, will present a possible evolution and update of the EFC Budget 2020.

The BoA will be invited to approve the proposition of the budget for 2020 for recommendation to the General Assembly for final approval.

6-3 EFC Subscription Fees for 2021

A proposal for the subscription fees for 2021, including branches, will be presented.

The BoA Members will be invited to approve the proposed subscription fees for recommendation to the General Assembly.

6-4 Budget for 2021

The Honorary Treasurer, Ms. Julija Bugajeva, will present proposals for the budget for 2021.

The BoA will be invited to approve the proposed budget for 2021.

6-5 Adoption of Financial Report

Item 7 EFC Activities

7-1 EFC endorsed corrosion education (TP, WF)

A TF on EFC endorsed corrosion courses, lead by Prof. Daniela Zander, Chairman of the Working Party 7 on Corrosion Education, has been set up and met on 16 December 2019 in Frankfurt. The initial proposal of Prof. Daniela Zander was that EFC would become a certification body which could certify organisations and courses of Member Societies. However, the TF agreed that this possibility would be too difficult to implement in the near future.

The TF proposed that in a first stage, the EFC will deliver labels / endorsement to courses. In a second stage, the EFC will aim to become a notified body, able to deliver certification for courses. This would be possible only if there exists a European regulation on corrosion, which is currently not the case. Therefore, the EFC should carry some lobbying activities so that European authorities create the missing legislation.

The TF also agreed that the work needed to collect information on courses proposed by Member Societies is not possible to be carried out by the WP7 alone. The best way to collect this information was deemed to be via the Working Parties (WP) rather than via the Member Societies.

An action was placed on the Scientific Secretary, Dr. Roman Bender, to organise an extraordinary meeting of the STAC to take place on 30 March 2020. The objectives of this kick-off meeting was to inform WP Chairs on the approach retained and to ask them for their support to collect information on courses currently proposed by the Member Societies. The collection of the feedback from WP Chairs will be under the lead of the WP7.

Due to the Coronavirus Crisis, this meeting was cancelled.

During the PAC meeting of June 24 2020 Dr Tomáš Prošek expressed that it is very important to make progress on this topic and agreed to take the lead of a new parallel Task Force (TF) whose objective will be to define an EFC labelling (or endorsement) procedure of courses currently offered and proposed for such EFC labelling by EFC Member Societies. Contributors to this TF were proposed from CEFACOR (France) and iCorr (United Kingdom).

In order to avoid inefficient parallel work, it is important that WP7 is kept informed on the work of the new Task Force.

Prof. Wolfram Furbeth and Dr. Tomáš Prošek will report on progress made within WP7 and the new TF on EFC endorsed corrosion education, respectively.

7-2 Report of the Scientific Secretary (RB)

The report of the Scientific Secretary, Dr. Roman Bender, covering activities since the last March 2020 BoA meeting is presented in **Appendix 3**.

Due to the cancellation of EUROCORR 2020 in its physical format, during the Webinar BoA Meeting that took place on 25 June 2020, the BoA agreed that the EUROCORR 2023 bidders will be asked if they can renew their bid for 2024, and, in that case, no call for bid will be sent out for 2024.

The EFC President will report on the answers received from the EUROCORR 2023 bidders.

On the basis of these answers, the BoA will be invited to deliberate and propose possible changes, if any, to the selection procedure for EUROCORR 2024 which will then be put forward for announcement at the upcoming EFC General Assembly.

A report on possible future activities with China / CSCP will be presented by Dr. Tomáš Prošek and Prof. Arjan Mol.

9-3 *NACE International: Task Force on EFC Strategy (GH)*

During the EFC-NACE meeting in September 2018, NACE informed that they will open an office in Europe.

During the PACM that took place in London on 26 November 2018, Dr. Gareth Hinds informed that NACE is contacting targeted EFC Member Societies in Europe regarding the Global Partnership Agreement they propose worldwide.

He expressed that the EFC should need a common strategy and policy for its members regarding NACE actions.

During the EFC-NACE meeting that took place during EUROCORR 2019 in Seville, NACE officials agreed that there should be no conference organised by NACE in EUROPE other than on specific topics. Also, they agreed that all communication related to EUROCORR matters should go through EFC rather than through Member Societies. These decisions are included in a newly prepared and updated Memorandum of Understanding which was due to be signed in Spring 2020 at the CORROSION NACE Conference.

Given the cancellation of the CORROSION NACE Conference in 2020 and the change of EUROCORR 2020 from a physical to a virtual format, a virtual meeting between EFC and NACE was planned for September 3 2020.

Dr. Gareth Hinds will report on progress of this TF.

Proposal of EFC Grant from Dr. Hosseinpour

EUROCORR Flight 752 memorial Grant: for talented Iranian corrosion researchers

In the memorandum of the passengers and the crew members that lost their lives in the tragic airplane crash on 8 January 2020 in Iran, scientists and engineers all around the globe have decided to provide financial support to students or scientists in their earlier carrier in Iran to attend the annual EUROCORR conference. The travel grant comprises payment of 500-1000 Euro to one student living and studying in Iran each year. The EFC is hereby asked for an exemption of the conference fees for the winners of the **flight 752 memorial grant**. To promote gender equality, the grant will be awarded to male and female applicants alternately (in sequential years).

Further eligibility criteria:

- The applicants must be enrolled in an Iranian university during the time of application or have been graduated no longer than six months before the time of application.
- The applicants must demonstrate high-level performance, visible in extraordinarily good grades in their undergraduate/master's degrees.
- The applicants can be graduating students or doctoral researchers with the age of a maximum of 35 years.
- The applicant must showcase a reference letter from a full-time university professor that explicitly endorses the student.
- The applicants must provide a motivation letter in which they express the benefits of attending EUROCORR toward their career success.
- The applicants must reside in Iran at the time of application.

How to apply

Complete the **EUROCORR Flight 752 memorial Grant** application form (Including the motivation for applying for the grant)

Submission of grant application should be performed at the time of abstract submission for oral presentation at EUROCORR (End of January of the year which EUROCORR is taking place)

Evaluation of the grant applications will take place, once the decision on the submitted abstracts is made (End of April of the year which EUROCORR is taking place)

The selected recipient of the **EUROCORR Flight 752 memorial Grant** should confirm her/his participation in EUROCORR within **two weeks** after receiving the letter from EUROCORR; otherwise, the grant will be transferred to the next eligible applicant.

The grant will be awarded in cash during the EUROCORR.

In the case of the absence of the eligible applicants or their failure to attend the EUROCORR, the grant budget will be transferred to the next EUROCORR (with the possibility of awarding two candidates).

Note to the EFC: Since the total donated sum may vary from time to time, the exact amount of grant shall be determined according to the total available fund as well as the travel costs each year. An economy return flight from Tehran to Budapest (as an example) costs around 350-300 €. Cheap accommodation in Budapest (breakfast included) for 4 nights would cost around 250-300 €. In the case, EUROCORR allows the full waiver of the registration fee (300 € for students), the Grant money would easily cover most of the applicant's travel + accommodation costs.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

EFC FINANCE REPORT TO BOA (SEPTEMBER 2020)

The enclosed finance report covers results for 2019, update on 2020 forecast and budget for 2021.

Results for 2019

I am pleased to report that in 2019 EFC made an overall surplus of €33,885 as shown in Annex 1.

On the income side, just over €51,500 in membership subscriptions were received in 2019, while EUROCORR in Seville was very successful bringing in €57,000 in levy. Further €8,000 levy were received as a result of a joint EUROCORR event held in China.

Most the 2019 expenditure was in line with the budget and is detailed in Annex 1.

Support for working parties of €2,130 relates to the funding 3 participants at Corrosion Summer School in Slovenia. While no funds were spent on EFC international activities in 2019, Young EFC increased their level of activity and organised a number of well attended events during the EUROCORR. Expenditure on strategic actions, such as redevelopment of EFC website, was postponed to 2020.

As a result EFC ended 2019 with a surplus of €33,885 compared to a budgeted surplus of €250.

Forecast for 2020

Given the effect of Covid-19 on the global economy, financial forecast for 2020 has been revised a number of times. Current 2020 forecast is shown in Annex 2 and includes a guaranteed minimum levy of €25,000 agreed for the virtual EUROCORR. The forecast also assumes that there will be no physical EFC meetings until the end of the year and therefore no travel expenditure will be incurred.

As BOA members are aware, development of the new EFC website has progressed well and 2020 forecast includes €20,000 agreed strategic actions expenditure. Development of the training courses has been postponed to 2021.

After taking into account all the changes, it is expected that EFC will end 2020 with a deficit of €19,500 compared to an originally budgeted deficit of €42,300.

Budget for 2021

Budget for 2021 is also shown in Annex 2. One of the key assumptions for 2021 budget is that the world returns to normal and EUROCORR in Budapest and all physical meetings will take place. This of course is subject to change. The budget also includes €22,500 reserved for the development of training courses.

2021 subscription fees

Status of 2020 subscriptions received by 9 September is shown in Annex 3.

Given the economic impact of Covid-19, it is proposed that there is no increase in membership subscription fees in 2021.

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REPORT OF THE SCIENTIFIC SECRETARY TO BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS
(July 2020)

During EUROCORN 2019 conference, 9th to 13th September in Seville, Spain, I took the minutes of the STAC meeting on 9th September. Later on the same day I participated in the meeting of the EFC Board of Administrators and the EFC General Assembly on 10th September. I chaired the programme meeting of the International Scientific Committee planning the EUROCORN 2020 on 11th September. Some extra Workshops and Joint Sessions were added to the topics of this upcoming event. The timeline and the plan for the coming weeks were discussed with the current Chairs.

The organisers of EUROCORN 2020 informed the attendees that they would like to change the way in which the poster exhibition is conducted. This was discussed in detail. The date for the Paper Selection Meeting was set for 30 March 2020 in Brussels.

I also took part in the EFC-NACE-, EFC-CSCP-, TF Corrosion Education-, TF on Digital Strategy meetings, the meeting of the **Board of Administrators** of the WCO and was panel speaker at the WCO panel discussion on corrosion and digitization. I took the minutes of some of the meetings and distributed them after the conference. For the rest of the week I spent some time meeting representatives of upcoming EUROCORN conferences to have a look at the workflow related to the collaboration between the local organisers and the EUROCORN Congress Secretariat at DECHEMA.

After the EUROCORN the Task Force on Digital Strategy had several conference calls to discuss the possibilities to make the appearance of the EFC more modern and attractive. The results were also presented at the PAC meeting on December 17th and implementation was started.

On December 16th, the Task Force "Corrosion Education" met in Frankfurt in order to discuss various possibilities on how knowledge about corrosion in Europe can be distributed on a broader basis by means of establishing a further education program and corresponding certification. These further education courses are to be offered via the EFC also in countries which do not have their own corrosion society. The results will be presented at an extraordinary STAC meeting in Brussels on 30th March, as the WP Chairs will be actively involved in the work.

I was part of a working group that revised the EFC Strategic Plan. The group consisted of Vice President (Jörg Vogelsang), STAC Chairman (Wolfram Fürbeth) and the Scientific Secretary (Roman Bender). Several meetings and telephone conferences were held to discuss individual work packages. This was discussed and approved during the meeting of the President Advisory Committee on 17th December, at which I also attended.

In December I started with the organisation of the EFC booth at the NACE CORROSION 2020 Conference and Exhibition in Houston, Texas from 15th-19th March. I collected promotional material advertising the upcoming EUROCORNs in Brussels (2020) and Budapest (2021). Furthermore, some leaflets containing information announcing the EFC Green books published by Elsevier were produced. The promotional material was sent to Houston before CORROSION 2020 was initially postponed to a later date in June. The event was eventually cancelled by NACE at the end of May.

REPORT OF THE SCIENTIFIC SECRETARY TO BOARD OF ADMINISTRATORS (Continued)

In mid-February I composed the first draft of the scientific programme of the upcoming EUROCORN 2020, it was circulated by the DECHEMA conference office at the end of February. The planned paper selection meeting at the end of March in Brussels was cancelled as a physical meeting and instead took place as a virtual meeting.

From the end of March to mid-July I participated in numerous virtual EFC meetings. The focus of these meetings was the preparation of the virtual EUROCORN in September 2020 as a replacement for the face to face EUROCORN. In order to promote the virtual EUROCORN and to show potential speakers the procedure of a virtual meeting, I participated in the organisation and realisation of several events, for example the WCO-Webinar "Corrosion and Low Carbon Energies", the EFC-Webinar "Corrosion Protection by Organic Coatings" and the EFC-Webinar on "Nuclear Corrosion".

Throughout the whole period since September 2019 I have been in continuous contact with different colleagues from EFC and other corrosion related organisations. The day-to-day work has been occupied with administrative matters including the allocation of EFC Event numbers, the maintenance and update of the EFC homepage including the EFC Calendar of Events, the Working Party pages and the restricted areas. I also tried to encourage the people who had applied for an EFC Event number to deliver a report of the event to be included in the EFC Newsletter.

Furthermore, I assisted colleagues working on new editions of the green books and established the connection to the respective contact person at Elsevier.

Report of the Managing Officer to the Board of Administrators
(Period April to August 2020)

Since May 2020, I have focused my work on the visibility of EFC on the professional social media LinkedIn, with the support of the Young EFC. The actions included the setting up of the company page and the discussion group on LinkedIn, the organisation of the workflow on the platform Trello (allowing the planning and reviewing process of the content to be published) and the preparation and collection of content to be published.

I prepared the scheme of the offer Affiliate Membership & Exhibition Booth and of the Loyalty Programme to be proposed to the organisers of EUROCORN 2021, in coordination with the Belgian organisation team of EUROCORN 2020 who shared their feedback on their experience with this scheme.

During the period in question, I also finalised the Manual EUROCORN containing instructions for bidders and organisers of the conference.

A significant part of my work is dedicated to administrative tasks and to support to the EFC offices. In the period in question, I especially treated the publication in the official Belgian journal of the new board composition, including the setting up of a file-sharing solution ensuring secure exchange of sensitive information such as ID documents, and the collection of new documents needed for the publication.

Regular tasks include the responsibility for the logistics and documents of the PAC meeting, the planning of extra meetings during EUROCORN, the logistics and documents of some of these extra meetings, the contribution to the preparation of the documents of the BoA and GA meetings, the EUROCORN Young Scientist Grant (YSG) (call for applications, interface with applicants and winners, printing of the diplomas), and support to the Belgian office for the registration of the annual accounts of the EFC to Belgian authorities.

Young-EFC Report Activities March – September 2020

A) Cancellation of YEFC activities for Eurocorr2020

The planned activities organised by the YEFC (represented by Yaiza Gonzalez) along with local organisers of Eurocorr2020 (including several social events, YEFC meeting and supporting new initiatives) were suspended due to the cancellation of physical Eurocorr2020.

B) Corrosion Awareness Day-April 24th

The 2020 edition of the event was strongly supported by the YEFC, who invited young researchers to actively take part on online action(s) to raise awareness of the extensive problems caused by corrosion. Due to the international situation with respect to the COVID-19 virus, participants were encouraged to innovate and modify their initiatives to an online and safe format. On the 24 of April 2020, 12 activities were independently organized by 24 participants with more than 200 attendees.

-From the Eduardo Torroja Institute of Spanish National Research Council, the webinar entitled "how does corrosion influence the health of concrete?" was conducted by Javier S. Montero, Nuria R. Ramos and Julio T. Martín.

-During an event on March 3rd, Luciane S. Santos and Leonardo B. Coelho, from the University of Mons (Belgium) received high school students for the event "Predicting corrosion protection: First sight at Electrochemical Impedance Spectroscopy".

-The Hungarian Corrosion Awareness Day was organized by Dorina Kovács (HUNKOR) and Balázs Varbai (Budapest University of Technology), who promoted an online photo competition on the Facebook page of HUNKOR.

-PhD students of the ITN mCBEEs (Live Mølmen, Institutes of Sweden; Salil Sainis, Jönköping University; Sabrina P. Rosoiu, University Politehnica of Bucharest) made videos describing the corrosion problems they are working on, and how they are helping solve these problems.

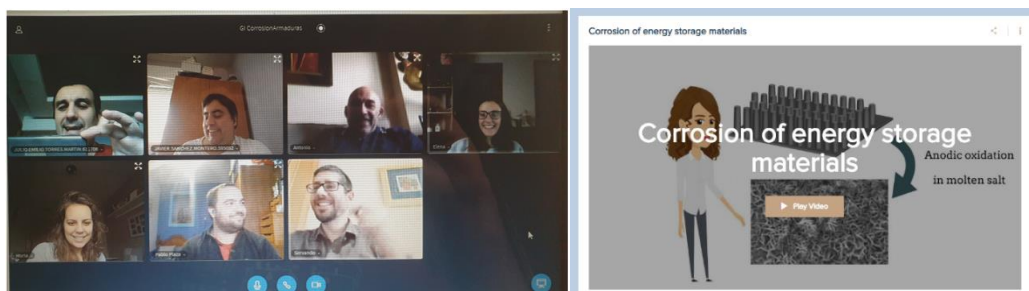
-Dr. Eva García-Lecina, Dr. Gemma Vara and Dr. Jesús Manuel Vega (CIDETEC Surface Engineering) published 6 dissemination articles related to corrosion science during the entire week. The subject was "keeping in touch with corrosion" and was published through the LinkedIn account of our organization.

The free course was oriented for young researchers and engineers challenged by the need for ingenious technical expertise combined with a strong scientific understanding of fundamental materials and corrosion problems.
