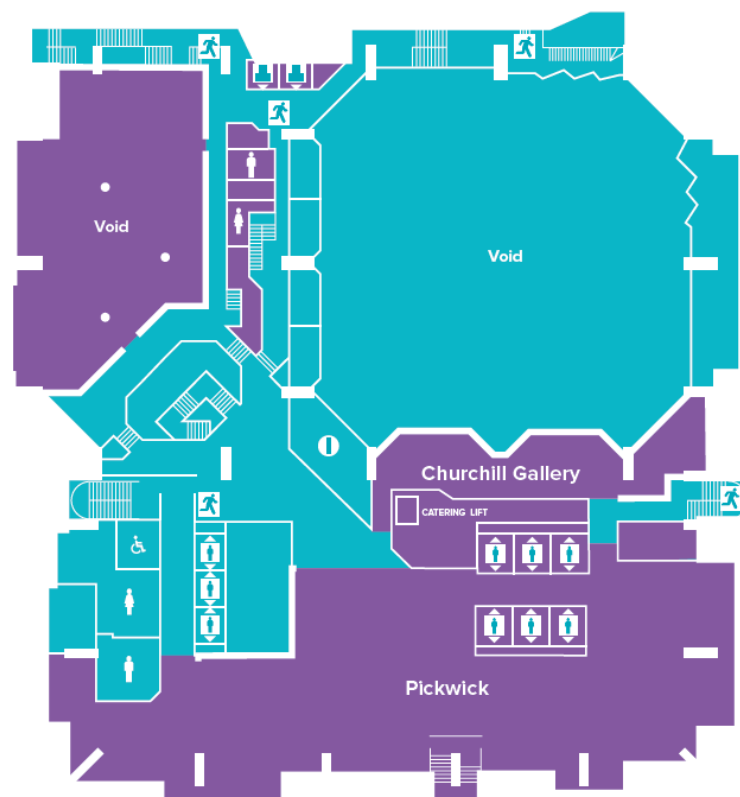

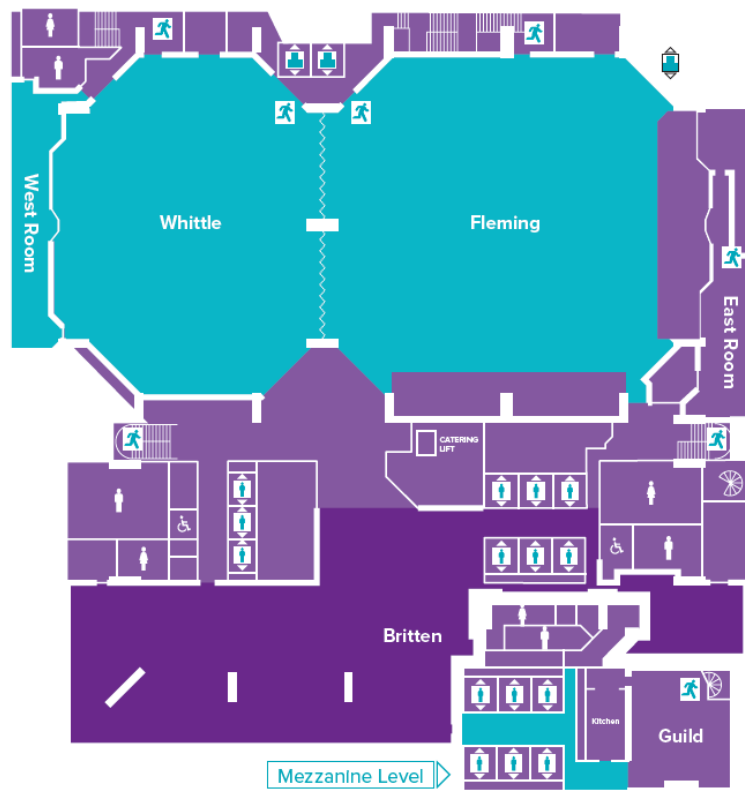

The QEII Centre is located in the heart of Central London, opposite Westminster Abbey and just a short walk from Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament. The Centre is within walking distance of three mainline and two underground stations with proximity to the new 24-hour tube system. The Eurostar terminal at St Pancras International Station is a short journey from Victoria, providing instant access to Europe.



There are six international airports within easy reach, offering direct flights to 396 destinations across the globe. This makes the QEII Centre one of the most accessible conference venues in the world.



ACCOMMODATION:

The QEII Centre is centrally located, with thousands of hotel rooms ranging from budget to executive luxury accommodation, only a short walk away. All of the hotels are easily accessible by public transport and by virtue of being close to QEII Centre, they are also close to some of the city's most impressive tourist attractions, including Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square and the South Bank.

As you would expect from one of the world's great capital cities, London has a vast range of accommodation options to suit every budget. Over 140,000 hotel rooms are available across the city and there is increasing availability of serviced apartments and airbnb rentals. A list of the closest hotels to the QEII Centre is provided in Annex IV.

Budget hotels such as Travelodge and the Premier Inn offer affordable rooms in central London and the surrounding suburbs for less than €100 per night. Student accommodation is available in the halls of residence of local universities, with rates per night of approximately €75. Cheaper hostel accommodation is widely available.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME

Transfer of best practice in corrosion engineering from established industries such as oil and gas and nuclear power will be critical to the success of this transition. At the same time, corrosion practitioners will need to adapt their capabilities and expertise to match the demand from these new applications.

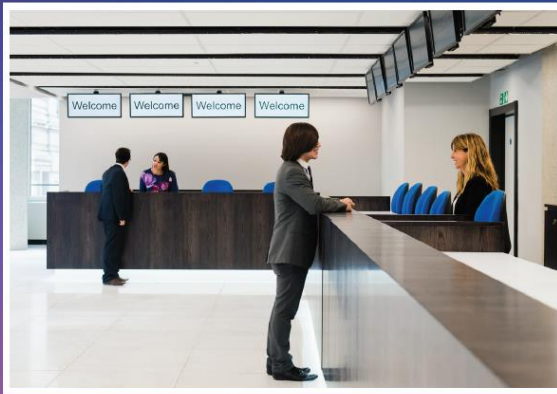
